PERSONAL REFLECTION

- When you hear that God delights in you and calls you His child, what emotions or thoughts rise up in you?

LIVING AS GOD’S PEOPLE

- Mari said the world will know we belong to God by the way we love one another. What are practical ways Northgate can reflect that love and unity in everyday life?
- Since we are made in God’s image and thrive in community, how has being part of the body of Christ helped you grow in faith?

DEEPER QUESTION
