His sound effects work on Yuri Rasovsky's Sherlock Holmes Theater contributed to its winning an Audie Award--the Oscar of audiobooks. Plot Synopsis:

I offer two different pageant versions of The Nativity Play--one with dialogue and narration and one with just narration. I also have three traditional stage-play versions of varying length and detail —a 70-minute, 30-minute and 15-minute. All dramatize Mary and Joseph's life, leading to the birth of Jesus-mixing reverence and humor to make for an uplifting and entertaining presentation.

The Pageant version -- (with narration and some dialogue) begins with several shepherds lamenting life after The Fall and wishing for a Redeemer, then shifts to Nazareth, where a pious and charitable Mary receives the Annunciation, then-9 months later--the Journey to Bethlehem, No Room at the Inn, the Birth of Jesus, the shepherds and the Host of Angels, the Adoration of the Magi, and a final blessing. This pageant version features 9 familiar Christmas carols, interspersed between and amidst the narration and dialogue.

The Pageant version -- (narration only) begins with a welcoming, then proceeds through The Annunciation, then--9 months later--the Journey to Bethlehem, No Room at the Inn, The Birth of Jesus, the shepherds and the Host of Angels, the Adoration of the Magi and a final blessing. This features 9 familiar Christmas carols, interspersed between scenes.

The 15-minute play version features longer dialogue and several extra scenes not depicted in the pageant versions. It begins with several shepherds lamenting life after The Fall and wishing for a Redeemer, then shifts to Nazareth where a pious and charitable Mary receives the Annunciation, then-9 months later--the Journey to Bethlehem, No Room At The Inn, the Birth of Jesus, the shepherds and the Host of Angels, the Adoration of the Magi, Herod's fury, the Slaughter of the Innocents, The Flight to Egypt and the Return from Egypt.

The 30-minute version begins with several shepherds lamenting life after The Fall and wishing for a Redeemer, then shifts to Nazareth, where a pious and charitable Mary receives the Annunciation. Then, Mary's visit to Elisabet and Zakarais, Mary's return home, Joseph's dilemma, his angel dream, and a reconciliation between Joseph and Mary. Act 2 includes the Journey to Bethlehem, No Room At The Inn, the Birth of Jesus, the shepherds and the Host of Angels, the prophecies of Simeon and Anna, the Adoration of the Magi, Herod's fury, the Slaughter of the Innocents, The Flight to Egypt and the Return from Egypt. This version has trimmed versions of the canticles from Luke: Mary's "Magnificat" and Simeon's "Nunc Dimittis"—all in English, of course. (Optionally this version inserts 10 carols into the drama.)

SCENE 1 - THE WELCOMING EXT. THE HOLY LAND - DUSK (JANUARY) (NARRATOR)

THE NARRATOR ENTERS to introduce the story.

NARRATOR: Welcome, one and all, to our recounting of The Nativity;

How--amidst darkness and despair--there came a Light

from Heaven; A Light of salvation, a light of forgiveness, of

peace...

And a Light of joy!...the birth of Jesus Christ. A birth into

the world and a birth within our hearts...

SONG: [CAROL-01] "GOD REST YE, MERRY GENTLEMEN" (VERSE 1)

SUNG BY ALL PERFORMERS

(OPTIONALLY INCLUDING AUDIENCE)

NARRATOR: Thank you, ladies <u>and</u> gentlemen. However, our tale does

not start upon Christmas <u>morning</u>. We begin--B.C.--<u>Before</u> Christ. It is a world in <u>need</u> of redemption. Behold! ...one Winter's night--on a hillside near Bethlehem, amidst

"certain poor shepherds in fields where they lay..."

SCENE 2 – THE SHEPHERDS' LAMENT EXT. BETHLEHEM HILLSIDE – NIGHT (JANUARY) (EFRAYIM, TAVEE, BO'AZ, SHEEP #1)

THE SHEPHERDS ENTER.

EFRAYIM: (SHIVERS) Oh! Winter! Such terrible weather!

BO'AZ: (APPROACHING) Yes! So cloudy! I have not seen such

weather since... well.... not since Noah.

TAVEE: (AMAZED) <u>Noah</u>? Of the Ark?

BO'AZ: Yes! It looked like rain then, too!

EFRAYIM: (SKEPTICAL) What...? Noah...?

TAVEE: How old <u>are</u> you?

BO'AZ: Me? Hmmm, Let me recall... (COUNTS ON FINGERS)

Eighty... eighty-one... eighty-two... a thousand! Yes! Yes! I

am very old. Very old!

EFRAYIM: (SCOFFS) A thousand? Bah! You are a mere shepherd--and

all that you say is but ill-spun wool!

ALL THREE SHEPHERDS: (LAUGHTER--AD LIB) oh-oh-oh!

TAVEE: Ah, but what a filthy, cold life this is!

SHEEP #1: (BLEATS-INDIGNANTLY) Baaaaa!

EFRAYIM: Better to be here--in the real wilderness--than amidst the

wilderness of spirit, in the towns and villages.

TAVEE: Oh, what a <u>dismal</u> world! A night-mare! How shall I ever

sleep?

SHEEP #1: (BLEATS--INNOCENTLY) Baaaahh.

BO'AZ: (CHIDING) Um... Well... have you tried... have you tried...

counting... sheep?

SHEEP #1: (BLEATS-DERISIVELY) Baaaah.

ALL THREE SHEPHERDS: (LAUGHTER--AD LIB) oh-oh-oh!

THE SHEPHERDS EXIT.

SCENE 3 - THE ANNUNCIATION

EXT. OLIVE GROVE - NIGHT (LATE MARCH)

(NARRATOR, MARY, ANGEL #1)

NARRATOR: But far north, near the village of Nazareth, a pious young

woman named Mary came unto a verdant olive grove--a

place of great peace and contemplation...

MARY and LAMB ENTER.

LAMB: (BLEATING) Baaaaaaah.

MARY: Ah, my little lamb! I have found you! Come, we shall return

home to...

LAMB: (BLEATING) Baaaaaaah.

MARY: (GASPS) Aaaahhhh!

ANGEL #1 ENTERS.

ANGEL #1: Rejoice, Mary! The Lord is with thee! Bless-ed art thou

among women!

MARY: (FEARFUL) Bless-ed...? <u>Me</u>...?

ANGEL #1: Fear not, Mary. Rejoice! For thou hast found favor with The

Lord. <u>Behold!</u> Thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son!--the anointed one--the Christ! And thou shalt

call his name... Jesus.

MARY: (REALIZING) The Messiah...? (GRATEFUL) Oh, heavenly

messenger... (UNSURE) I... I... Yes! (TEARFULLY

JOYOUS) Behold... the handmaid of the Lord! Let it be unto

me... according to thy word. (BOWS HER HEAD IN

PRAYER) Yes.

SONG: [CAROL-02] "AVE MARIA" (VERSE 1)

SUNG BY ANGEL ONLY

(OPTIONALLY, CHORUS JOINS)

ANGEL #1 EXITS.

LAMB: (BLEATING) Baaaaaah!

MARY falls to her knees, lowers her head, clasps hands in prayer.

NARRATOR: (SLOWLY) And Mary was humbly trans-<u>fixed!</u> ...A soul... in

wonder..! (PAUSE) The Holy Spirit came <u>unto</u> her... And filled her... with the Grace of The Lord... (PAUSE) And she felt the <u>joy</u>, the <u>harmony</u> of The Christ <u>within</u> her heart.

(PAUSE) ...A soul... in wonder!...

MARY looks skyward.

MARY: (HUMBLY PRAYING) Lord, I... feel... thy loving-kindness...

a... "lamp unto my feet, a light unto my path."

NARRATOR: And thus, through a simple farm girl, the Lord's divine plan

for the Salvation of Human-kind was set forth: The Son of

God would become... The Son of Man!

MARY rises slowly and EXITS during song.

SONG: [CAROL-03] "O COME, O COME, EMMANUEL" (VERSE 1 & 2)

SUNG BY CHORUS

SCENE 4 - COME UNTO BETHLEHEM EXT. BETHLEHEM INN - NIGHT (DECEMBER 24TH) (NARRATOR)

During narration and song, JOSEPH and the now 9-months pregnant MARY quietly ENTER, optionally with donkey.

NARRATOR: Months later--as Winter neared--there came a decree from

Caesar Augustus, that all the world should be taxed--each returning unto their tribal village. And so it was, Mary's husband, Joseph--being a Bethlehem-ite--went out from Galilee. And he took with him his young wife, who was now

great with child.

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SCENE 5 - NO ROOM AT THE INN

EXT. BETHLEHEM INN - NIGHT (DECEMBER 24TH)

(NARRATOR, JOSEPH, INN-KEEPER, MARY, RACHAB)

NARRATOR: And--at the end of nine days travel--they did arrive at the

tiny village of Bethlehem. But it was crowded with <u>other</u> travelers, there--also--to be counted. Joseph and Mary

came upon the only inn to be found in the village.

JOSEPH leaves Mary and approaches the door. He knocks (3X).

The INN-KEEPER opens it and leans out.

RACHAB--quietly--ENTERS. She stops and observes the conversation.

JOSEPH: (APPROACHING) Excuse me, inn-keeper, sir. Do you have

lodging available for my wife and myself? We have traveled-

-many days--from Galilee and are weary.

INN-KEEPER: (WEARY) No! There is no room. <u>No</u> room! Every straw

<u>pallet</u> is full! There is no room for <u>any</u>-more travelers!

JOSEPH: But, you see, my wife is expecting a child.

INN-KEEPER: Sleep in the fields below. Or the road!

JOSEPH: She is due to bear the child... soon. Perhaps to-night.

INN-KEEPER: (TAKEN ABACK) Uhh.. I am sorry. (EXITING) But... I

cannot help you. Go!

INN-KEEPER EXITS, shutting door.

JOSEPH: (TO HIMSELF) Oh... What shall I do? (CALLS OUT) Mary?

MARY: (DISTANT) Yes, Joseph.

JOSEPH: They have no room. We shall have to look elsewhere.

MARY: (DISTANT) There is not much time....

RACHAB: (APPROACHING) Wait! Sir! Ahaz ("AY-hez")-- the inn-

keeper--is my master, but I think you could lodge in the

stable.

JOSEPH: The stable? But my wife...

RACHAB: The stable is dirty, yes. But it is dry--and out of the cold. Go

down that path, there!

JOSEPH: Thank you. Thank you for your generosity...

RACHAB: You need some-where to stay. I was homeless once, myself.

JOSEPH: Thank you.

JOSEPH gets Mary and begins to lead her and the donkey towards the stable.

JOSEPH: (EXITING) Mary! We have found respite...

SONG: [CAROL-04] "OH LITTLE TOWN OF BETHLEHEM" (VERSE 1)

SUNG BY CHORUS

(OPTIONALLY, AUDIENCE JOINS)

SCENE 6 - THE BIRTH OF JESUS

INT. CAVE/STABLE - AFTER MIDNIGHT (DECEMBER 25TH) (NARRATOR, INFANT JESUS, MARY, JOSEPH)

SETTING:

The Stable/Cave can be just some wooden poles with a cross-beam, and perhaps, even a peaked roof--like a traditional Christmas crèche. It is open-faced --with a manger. Straw can litter the stable floor.

NARRATOR: While a rustic stable was hardly where one imagined the

Savior of man-kind to come into the world, this was all the

poor couple could provide. (PAUSE) Yet... just after

midnight, it came to pass that Mary gave birth to her child...

INFANT JESUS: (NEWBORN CRY) Waaaah!

MARY: (HOLDING HIM UP) There, there, now... my beautiful

boy...

NARRATOR: And she named her son, Jesus--thereby fulfilling the

prophecy of the angel of the Lord.

MARY: (TO JOSEPH) Joseph! Come see!

JOSEPH rushes in, joining Mary, who continues to follow the actions described by the narration.

SONG: [CAROL-05] "THE COVENTRY CAROL" (VERSE 1)

SUNG BY MARY ONLY

JOSEPH: (APPROACHING) Ohhhh! How wonder-ful!

NARRATOR: Then Mary <u>washed</u> the Holy Child. And did take a small vial

of olive oil, and dabbed some upon his head, and kissed him. A new light had come unto a weary world. And it was

good...

ANGELS ENTER, surrounding the stable area.

SONG: [CAROL-06] "AWAY IN A MANGER" (VERSES 1 & 2)

SUNG BY ANGELS, ANIMALS & CHORUS

During the song, SHEPHERDS quietly ENTER, to occupy the "pasture area."

TAVEE lies sleeping. SHEEP #1 grazes nearby (Can be a doll, voiced from OFF-STAGE).

SCENE 7 - THE SHEPHERDS COME

EXT. BETHLEHEM HILLSIDE - 3 AM (DECEMBER 25TH)

(NARRATOR, BO'AZ, EFRAYIM, TAVEE, SHEEP #1, ANGEL #2, ANGELS)

NARRATOR: Later--upon a nearby hillside--"certain poor shepherds"

were keeping watch over their flocks of sheep and goats. In

those times, shepherds were outcasts, wanderers, the

poorest of the poor...

SONG: [CAROL-07] "THE FIRST NOEL" (VERSE 1)

SUNG BY SHEPHERDS & CHORUS

(OPTIONALLY, AUDIENCE JOINS)

EFRAYIM: (DISGUSTED) Ohhhh! Bo'Az! Tavee is dozing again! And

on his watch!

BO'AZ: <u>Again</u>? I should <u>never</u> have suggested he count sheep!

EFRAYIM: And so many sheep!

SHEEP #1: (BLEATING) "Baaahhh!"

ANGEL #2 ENTERS--holding the Star of Bethlehem aloft.

ANGEL #2: <u>Behold</u>, shepherds!

SHEEP #1: (BLEATING--FRIGHTENED) "Baaahhh!"

TAVEE: (WAKING) ZZZZZ--Wha...? (SCREAMS) Ahhh!

ANGEL #2: Behold! I bring you good tidings of great joy! Unto you is

born this day a Savior! Christ, the Lord!

EFRAYIM: (STUNNED) The... the... Messiah! He has come!

ANGEL #2: You shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying

in a manger.

SHEEP #1: (BLEATING) "Baaahhh!"

A host of ANGELS ENTER. (They can each hold a star aloft.)

BO'AZ: (SHUSHES TAVEE) Shhh! The... the stars! Look! Angels!

(AMAZED) ...<u>Angels!</u>

ANGELS: "Glory to God in the highest! And--on Earth--peace and

good will toward men."

SONG: [CAROL-08] "ANGELS WE HAVE HEARD ON HIGH" (VERSES 1 & 2)

SUNG BY ANGELS & CHORUS

(OPTIONALLY, AUDIENCE JOINS)

The host of ANGELS EXIT.

SHEPHERDS follow along with actions in narration, CROSSING to the Stable area.

NARRATOR: It was a host of angels. And the peace on Earth they

proclaimed was the harmony and wholeness found in the Lord! (PAUSE) The shepherds went <u>up</u>--out of the valley--unto Bethlehem. And, finding a light in the stable, did visit

the family to see the Christ Child...

TAVEE: (APPROACHING) Oh! How small! How helpless he is!

BO'AZ: How amazing! (TO EFRAYIM) Come, Efrayim. Gaze upon...

the Savior!

EFRAYIM falls to his knees, stupefied by the child.

EFRAYIM: (TIMIDLY) I... I... (TO MARY, WHISPERS) Thank you.

MARY rises and picking up the child, offers him to EFRAYIM.

MARY: (TO EFRAYIM) Here, then! <u>Hold</u> him.

TAVEE: Go, Efrayim! <u>Hold</u> the child!

EFRAYIM: (TAKING THE CHILD) I... I...

INFANT JESUS: (NEWBORN CRY) Waaa-aaaa!

EFRAYIM: (GASPS) Ohhh! (PANICKED, GIVES CHILD BACK TO

MARY) Here...!

ALL: (HEARTY LAUGHTER) Ha-ha-ha!

BO'AZ: If this humble... infant can be the Messiah, then, surely, any

of us may enter... the Kingdom of Heaven.

JOSEPH: Bless you! Your joy is our reward.

TAVEE: Our joy comes from full hearts. Praise be unto the Lord!

SHEPHERDS withdraw, EXITING . MALKIOR, GASPAR & BALTAZAR ENTER at verse 2.

SONG: [CAROL-09] "THE FIRST NOEL" (VERSES 1, 2 & 3)

SUNG BY MAGI & CHORUS

(OPTIONALLY, AUDIENCE JOINS)

SCENE 8 - THE ADORATION OF THE MAGI

INT. STABLE - DAY (FEBRUARY)

(MARY, JOSEPH, INFANT JESUS, GASPAR, MALKIOR, BALTAZAR,

NARRATOR)

NARRATOR: And it came to pass, that there arrived from the East, three

Magi ("MADGE-eye")--skilled in the arts of astrology and

ancient lore.

MARY: <u>Do!</u> Do come in.

JOSEPH: We are but a <u>poor</u> family, yet you are welcome here. Truly!

MALKIOR: We are Magi ("MADGE-eye") from the lands of Persia,

India and Assyria.

GASPAR: We have followed a star in the heavens, that has led us

here--to the Messiah.

BALTAZAR: We bring offerings to him!

MALKIOR: (OFFERING) Gold dust... That he may transmute the

baseness of man-kind into the gold of Heaven!

GASPAR: (OFFERING) Frankincense... the perfume of the Sanctuary-

-to drive away the stench of Evil.

BALTAZAR: (OFFERING) Myrrh... to infuse the scented oil for

anointing this Divine Child.

MARY: We thank you. Thank you for these gifts--and that you...

believe so.

JOSEPH: May the Lord's blessing be upon you and all your people.

JOSEPH, MARY--holding the child--stand, facing the audience. They are joined by all performers

NARRATOR:

And as the prophet Isaiah foretold: "The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light: And they that dwell in the shadow of death..., upon them hath the light shined." (PAUSE) Thus... did a new chapter in the life of Man-kind open; One with endless promise, divine mercy and eternal gain! (PAUSE) Rejoice, all people! The Savior had comefor now and ever-more!

SONG: [CAROL-10]

"OH, COME ALL YE FAITHFUL" (VERSES 1 & 2)
SUNG BY ALL PERFORMERS

(OPTIONALLY, AUDIENCE JOINS)

-- END OF PLAY--

Casting Monologues - 'The Nativity Play'

All actors are asked to read some lines, called "sides," aloud, to audition. The director will cast the roles in our production based upon these readings. Please take a moment to read the lines below several times, both silently and aloud. These monologues can also provide some "back story," giving an idea of who the characters are and what kind of story we are producing. Since radio actors often play several parts, we encourage the use of different voices or accents when auditioning for the different roles.

NARRATOR:

I am the Narrator and I speak in a measured style, often using a biblical syntax. For example: <u>But</u>--on the shore of the Great Sea--Joseph did now labor on Herod's palace at Caesarea. He served the old carpenter of Nazareth, Esdras ("EHZ-druhs"), <u>who</u>, while he had lost the sharpness of his <u>sight</u>, had lost <u>not</u> the sharpness of his <u>tongue</u>...

MARY:

Scripture says, "Despise <u>not</u> a thief, if he steals to satisfy his soul when he is hungry." It is not <u>stealing</u> if I <u>give</u> this man the pomegranates, is it? A little less for us shall suffice! I am <u>not</u> a simpleton, Aunt Morag! But that man <u>welcomed</u> the flogging! Why did he <u>do</u> that?

JOSEPH:

He said, "no Galilean carpenter would work terebinth." Well, I am <u>not</u> of Galilee. I am a Bethlehem-ite! I shall <u>gladly</u> work this terebinth lumber. But <u>Wait</u>, Mary! All Spring I did work in Caesarea and learned <u>much</u> about carpentry. And... <u>today</u>... (JOKING) I have invented... the <u>wheel</u>! (HOLDS UP SQUARISH WHEEL) Look!

ANGEL #1:

Rejoice, Mary! Hail thou--that art highly favored! The Lord is with thee! Bless-ed art thou among women! Behold! Thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son!--the anointed one-the Christ! And thou shalt call His name... Jesus.

BO'AZ:

(OLD SHEPHERD) Yea! David—the great <u>King</u> David—was once a mere shepherd boy. But the Lord <u>favored</u> him, and David did great deeds... (SIGHS) So long ago... Herod and the Romans are only the most <u>obvious</u> of evil-doers. The wolves are man-<u>kind</u>! Wickedness burns in every heart! For we are separated from the Lord... alas... (SIGHS) for-ever.

BALTAZAR:

From the East, we saw a new star rise--a brilliant light in the Heavens--and we have followed it here. You see, the stars portend, "As above, so below"--therefore the Messiah shall come from Bethlehem. But you are <u>wise</u>, great Herod... for a <u>king</u>.

RACHAB:

Wait! Sir! Ahaz ("AY-hez"), the inn-keeper--is my master, but I think you could stay in the stable. Ahaz may beat me for doing this, but you need <u>some</u>-where to stay. <u>I</u> was homeless once, myself. If you should require anything, come 'round the kitchen. (WHISPERS) But avoid Ahaz. He angers easily.

SHEEP #1:

Baaaaaah!

(BLEATS-INDIGNANTLY) Baaaaa! (BLEATS--INNOCENTLY) Baaaahh. (BLEATS-DERISIVELY) Baaaah.
