How can I push my child to go further?


Hold me accountable

Summer Workshops with YFS

Cake Camp

A four-session workshop that taught teens how to make and decorate cakes. In addition to learning life skills in the kitchen, this experience promoted skills in confidence, teamwork, and accepting imperfections.







The Fine Art of Friendship

A ten-session workshop that focused developing friendship, kindness, healthy communication, and empathy skills. Members learned these skills through various art activities and put on an art show with all of the work that they completed.
