## Requirements

- A total of 120 semester hours is required for graduation.
- Students are granted up to 36 hours of credit for previous nursing course work. A total of up to 81 hours may be transferred from a community college.
- At least 39 hours must be earned in courses numbered 300 –400. Nursing courses complete 33 of those required hours - an additional 6 hours of upper level 300/400 courses are required to meet graduation requirements.
- A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 in nursing courses is required.
- Nursing students may be admitted to Nursing with a GPA of 2.00.
- All students must meet graduation requirements as outlined in Union College Undergraduate Catalogue under Graduation Requirements.
