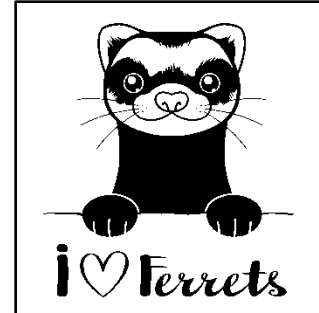




Ferret Deslorelin Implant *Adrenal Endocrinopathy Treatment*

As of March 2026, we can include the Deslorelin Implant as one of our treatment options. For ferrets who have either been diagnosed with Adrenal Endocrinopathy or have had alopecia as a diagnosis in the past, we are now able to provide your ferret with the Deslorelin Implant to treat adrenal endocrinopathy.



“DESCRIPTION Suprelorin® F (4.7 mg) Implant is a synthetic GnRH analogue (deslorelin acetate) in a biocompatible, slow release [sic] subcutaneous implant. The implant is a solid, opaque, white to pale yellow cylinder, 2.3 mm x 12.5 mm in length and weighing 50 mg. The Suprelorin® F (4.7 mg) Implant comes pre-loaded in an implanting needle. Each implant contains 4.7 mg deslorelin (as deslorelin acetate) in an inert matrix,” ([Virbac, 2020](#)).

“The recommended dosage is one, 4.7 mg implant per ferret every 12 months. Appropriate clinical monitoring is suggested to determine that the symptoms of adrenal disease are being adequately controlled.” ([Virbac, 2020](#))

For the implant procedure, the ferret will be sedated. The needle used is large so to enclose the implant, therefore we use sedation to ensure a smooth implantation process with reduced pain. Ferrets will be given a reversal medication to help them clear the sedative faster.
