

BRADY'S BEND TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS MEETING

March 2, 2026

Meeting began at 6:00pm

Supervisors present, Frank Bratkovich and Phil Anderson. Bob Kabay was absent.

PLEDGE TO THE FLAG

MINUTES: February 2026 meeting minutes were reviewed and approved. Motion by Phil, 2nd by Frank, approved by all, motion carried.

TREASURER REPORT: was read and approved. Motion by Phil, 2nd by Frank, approved by all, motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

* UAA President, Erich Myers, requested \$1,300 reimbursement for DuraEdge ballfield improvements. Motion made by Phil, 2nd by Frank, approved by all, motion carried. *It was confirmed with UAA representative that Karns City High School softball team (Bellis, Athletic Director) has permission to use the field for practices from 4-6 (5:15 on game days) each day as needed. Motion made by Phil, 2nd by Frank, approved by all, motion carried. Both UAA and KCHS participants will empty trash cans into the township dumpster regularly. Finally, regarding parking concerns: the supervisors requested that the overhead door and the backhoe be kept accessible at all times. No parking signs are to be put up. *It was requested that some additional trash cans with lids be available during softball and baseball season.

* Liquid Fuels funds were received from PennDot in the amount of \$100,631 for 2026 road maintenance. We expect to have enough salt and material to get us through the balance of winter. * Tammy Rondinelli, secretary in training, was welcomed. * Motion to accept bid for mowing from Kathy Montgomery. Motion made by Phil, 2nd by Frank, approved by all, motion carried. *There was a slight delay in county tax bills getting mailed out by the printer, but expected to go in the mail early this week. *Looking into a resolution for supervisor holiday pay. Will revisit at future meeting. *Maintenance included replacement of corner post on overhang; continuation of office buildout; new batteries for the international.

CITIZEN CONCERNS: *Honor Roll light to be looked at (not working during very cold days). *Rege Lewis asked about plans and timetable for fixing potholes on upper Seybertown Rd. It was communicated that a bid for resurfacing using French Mattress and 2A overlay is being researched. * Joe Curran requested that the potholes at the beginning of Iron Furnace Road (at 68 intersection) be filled with modified. Joe also has concerns about the safety of merging onto Rt 68 at the bottom of St. Mary's hill. He offered to pay for 2 tri-axle loads of stone to reroute the egress for St Mary's hill onto Rt 68 by going across the top and down the far side of the American Legion parking lot (during times when nobody is parked there). The supervisors indicated that an "off right of way" would be needed from the Legion and who to talk to about it for official approval.

ROAD REPORT. Plow, stone, salt, repeat. Also beginning pot hole filling.

MONTHLY BILLS: motion by Phil, 2nd by Frank, motion carried to pay monthly bills.

Meeting was adjourned at 6:30pm

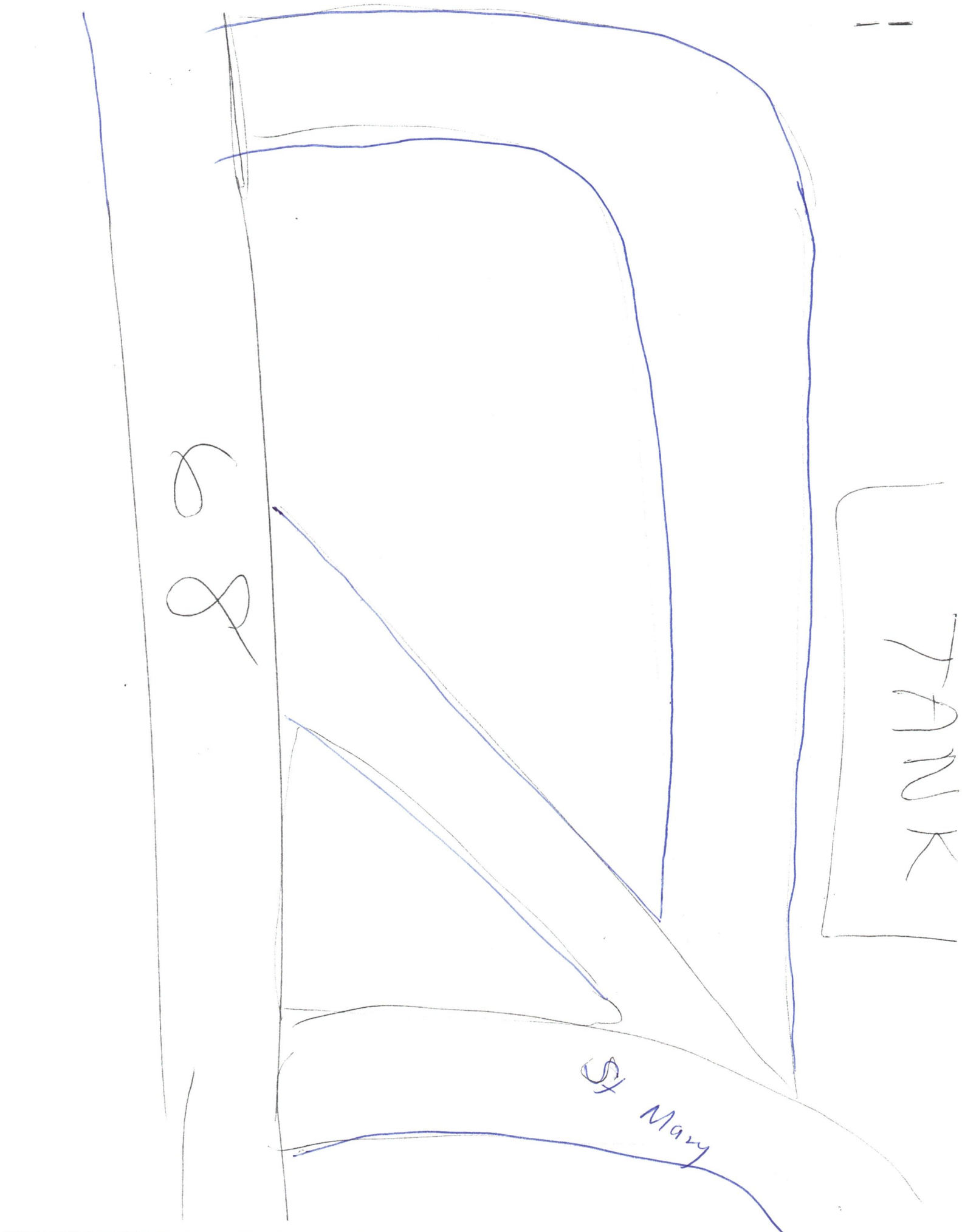

March 23, 2026 SPECIAL WORKING MEETING

Meeting began at 6:00pm

Supervisors present, Frank Bratkovich, Phil Anderson and Bob Kabay.

This Special Working Meeting was scheduled and advertised to work on clarifying our Holiday Pay policy so that a resolution could be adopted. Tammy will type up a resolution to be presented and approved at the April 6th township meeting.

Additional business: Frank had a list of road worker considerations including deciding on the Upper Seybertown scope of work. It was deemed that a bid will be requested from Jace Hiles to do the French Mattress and 2A overlay. *Upper Roseville needs attention - grinding and patching the worst spots. Sugarcreek Twp has agreed to share equipment use and laborers. *We will be borrowing a quickie saw and tamper to use on some road repairs. If we are pleased with the results, we can purchase our own for approx.. \$1,500. *We can use Jace Hiles equipment to do crack seal on the 3 newer paved roads including Cove Run, Kaylor Petrolia and Kaylor Frogtown.

Equipment repairs included a blockheater replacement. Rear tires on the backhoe are worn. Cost to replace the 2 rear tires is approximately \$4,900.

New summer employee situation was also discussed. Phil will work Tues, Wed and Thurs. Dave McElroy will work Tues and Thurs. Louis Rondinelli may be an option for a few days here and there if needed for any larger projects. Phil and Bob suggested that we make a list of all the needed roadwork and prioritize by the workers/hours we have, the cost, the funds available, etc. It was mentioned that we haven't cleaned out culverts for awhile.
