

Robertson Cliffs & King Mountain Trails



Welcome to Robertson Cliffs and King Mountain, a 1314-hectare property owned and protected by the Algoma Highlands Conservancy (AHC).

We are a volunteer-based not-for-profit binational charity that promotes conservation,

education, research and non-motorized recreation. The trails on our lands are open year-round for your enjoyment. The Voyageur Trail forms the backbone of our trail system.

Winter use of groomed ski trails and snowshoe trails on King Mountain and adjacent lands requires the purchase of a trail pass from Stokely Creek Lodge.





The Voyageur Trail is a hiking and snowshoeing trail that traverses the rugged Ontario landscape north of Lakes Huron and Superior. The trail is built and maintained by volunteers.

Voyageur Trail users are obliged to abide by the Trail Users' Code, which can be summed up with the credo: "Take nothing but photographs and leave nothing but your gratitude."
