Within our Brookings, Moody County, and Yankton Clubs, we were able to continue our mission to inspire and enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to realize their full potential as productive, responsible, and caring citizens through our academic success, character and leadership, and healthy lifestyles programs.

This year our Clubs focused on diversity and inclusion, prioritized mental health, and updated tutoring resources and opportunities. POWER UP

We run a five-week Academic Success program called Power Up, designed to combat summer learning loss and prepare youth for the school year ahead. Youth worked on math and comprehension skills, high-frequency words, and phonics and writing skills. Overall, we had 198 youth participate in the program!

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

Across all three Clubs we were able to serve 10,250 free meals to the youth in our communities. We also served 169,609 free snacks. Making sure our members never go hungry is an important aspect to our mission of providing a safe place for our youth.





TEENS AGAINST TOBACCO USE

Teens Against Tobacco Use (TATU) at the Moody County Club is focusing not only on anti-tobacco messaging this year but also on how "a vape-free life is the best life." Youth work to become comfortable discussing difficult tobacco and vaping topics and how it will negatively impact their health. Teens also designed graphics and planned a social media campaign to promote a vape-free life to their peers.

KIDS IN THE KITCHEN

Our Yankton Club hosted Kids in the Kitchen this year, inviting community members to join us at the Club and teach youth how to make easy healthy meals. Our members really enjoyed learning from each individual and serving the meal they made to their peers.

ENCOURAGING DIVERSITY

In 2021 our Clubs focused on diversity and inclusion. Each month we hosted a "Day of Diversity & Inclusion" in which Club members learned about a specific group of people or culture. The SDSU Black Student Alliance, Latin American Student Alliance, and Korean Student Alliance have all visited the Brookings Club to speak with members about different aspects of their culture.





CELEBRATING CREATIVITY

Encouraged by staff to showcase her talents, Brookings teen member, Shayonti, spent a few months in 2021 designing and painting a mural in the STEAM area at the Teen Center. The mural features items relating to teens and programs offered at the Club as well as inside jokes, pop culture, and personal interests.



TRAIL

TRAIL is a Boys & Girls Clubs of America diabetes prevention program geared toward Native American youth. Each lesson revolves around teaching youth healthy habits. All of our members at the Moody County Club are invited to participate in this program and enjoy trying healthy new snacks and activities.

INVESTING IN MENTAL HEALTH

To prioritize mental health as part of our healthy lifestyles programming, our Clubs continue to offer mentoring groups, encourage peer-to-peer support, and urge members to show off their accomplishments to promote positive self-esteem. We have updated our sensory rooms to provide a quiet space for members who are feeling anxious, and we partner with local counseling services to arrange more individualized counseling for our elementary youth, teens, and families when needed.





HOMEWORK HELP

Thanks to a grant from 21st Century, we implemented an extended Club Tutors program in Yankton. Teachers refer eligible 1st - 5th grade students to the after-school program based on reading and math testing scores. Club staff work with youth to reach grade-level skills through curriculum-based teaching and also provide other wellness opportunities such as counseling and food services.





INCOME \$4.35 M EXPENSE \$4.38 M






OUR 2021 ORGANIZATION ACTUAL INCOME

PROJECTED \$3,653,250


ACTUAL \$4,332,389*

Boys & Girls Club of Vermillion will serve elementary youth enrolled in the Vermillion School District after school and on nonschool days Monday through Friday, beginning at the start of the school year in fall 2022. While the Boys & Girls Club of Vermillion works to attain proper state licensing and hire a qualified and passionate full-time Executive Director to lead the Vermillion Club, the current Beyond School Adventures (BSA) after-school program will remain in place from January through August 2022. As Club staff and Advisory Council Members work to seek and build community relationships and partnerships, the Club's program will retain a fee-based structure to support operation, programming, and staffing costs. Boys & Girls Club of Vermillion's ultimate goal is to provide a safe, positive, and affordable drop-in facility available for all families in the Vermillion community.
