1. Federal Public Health Emergency Officially Renewed

- On January 11, 2023, the US Secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS) renewed the determination that a federal public health emergency (PHE) continues to exist. This was previously scheduled to expire on January 11, 2023. The <u>declaration</u> lasts for the duration of the emergency or up to 90 days but may be extended by the HHS Secretary. HHS has said it would provide states 60 days' notice before the PHE is allowed to expire or end.
- When Appendix K was approved, it included an additional six months beyond the end of the federal public health emergency to allow for the unwinding of the temporary flexibilities and the return to permanent/ongoing services. Appropriate services should be determined through the person-centered team planning process to determine which service(s) best meets the needs of the person and to have the service(s) set up and in place before the end of the six-month unwinding period.
- The current PHE is now scheduled to expire on April 11, 2023, unless extended by HHS, which means that the unwinding period will expire on October 11, 2023.

2. Vendor Selected: DODD Waiver Redesign Initiative

- The Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities (DODD), in partnership with the Ohio Department of Administrative Services, has awarded a contract to Deloitte Consulting LLP to work on the waiver redesign initiative. This initiative will redesign Ohio's waiver services system that supports people with developmental disabilities and their families to achieve their vision of a good life.
- The result will be the redesign, modernization, and simplification of current processes related to assessments, funding, rate setting, data collection, and establishing individual budgets for Medicaid Home and Community-Based Services Waivers administered by DODD.
- DODD's decision to take on this large initiative was in response to valuable input and feedback from our community and partners. This work will be a collaborative effort, and DODD will continue to listen to your challenges, wants for the future, and innovative ideas. There will be various opportunities for stakeholders to contribute and stay updated on progress in the coming months.

- Agency providers may receive a 1099 depending on the type of contractor as listed in OAKS. A corporation (including a limited liability company (LLC) that is treated as a C or S corporation) generally does not receive a 1099 form.
- Any inquiries regarding taxes should be directed to your accountant or to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Providers are self-employed and have sole responsibility for taxes. Taxes are not withheld by DODD, and DODD cannot assist with questions related to taxes.

2. DSP Retention Payments

- The Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities (DODD) launched the county boardfunded Direct Support Professional (DSP) retention payment initiative for independent providers and DSPs of agency waiver providers last year.
- o In July, the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) approved the initiative with an effective date of July 1, 2022. This allowed for these payments to be retroactive to that date. Quarterly payments were distributed to participating home and community-based waiver provider agencies that opted-in and Independent Providers who were in good standing.
- Participating agency providers are required to quarterly report certain data elements and attest that the funds were used in accordance with all requirements. Independent providers were also eligible for payments and did not need to opt-in or report to participate.
- Retention payments will be distributed quarterly from DODD to participating home and community-based waiver providers, and providers will then send retention payments to each eligible DSP.

- O The Ohio Departments of Medicaid, Aging and Developmental Disabilities appreciate the continued advocacy and stakeholder collaboration throughout this process of planning for the Appendix K authorities to end. As a reminder, Ohio's authorities sunset six months after the expiration of the public health emergency, on November 12, 2023. On July 13th, Ohio posted the PASSPORT, Assisted Living, Ohio HomeCare, MyCare, Individual Options, Level 1 and SELF waiver applications and associated Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rules up for public comment, in anticipation of an effective date of November 12, 2023.
- O Just recently, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) provided states with the option to extend approved flexibilities past the November 12th date, as long as the state is in the process of permanent amendments pending CMS review and approval. As a result, effective dates on the proposed waiver application amendments and corresponding OAC rules will be modified to reflect a new effective date of January 1, 2024. - They also plan to continue to maintain the exemptions for people assessed to need two-to-one staffing, need awake staff present around the clock, or meet the criteria for the complex care rate add-on. You can review these changes to the rule HERE.
- DODD has stated that they will continue to evaluate the medical assistance rate add-on and whether it should be included as an additional exemption as part of the ongoing Waiver Redesign work.
- To avoid duplication of services, DODD has also reinserted the pre-Appendix K requirement that people who receive homemaker/personal care on a day when their shared living provider does not bill must receive that homemaker/personal care outside of the shared living home. This requirement does not apply to the revised Residential Respite service that people may receive on the same day as Shared Living, or to the homemaker/personal care services that people who will be exempt from Shared Living may choose to receive after January 1, 2024.
- o DODD needs to update this rule because Shared Living and Homemaker/Personal Care are considered the same type of service, and federal government rules do not allow people to bill for the same service at the same time or at overlapping times. Shared Living is a daily service, so a person cannot receive HPC on a day when they receive Shared Living.
