Your grateful pastor,

Dear Saint John Fisher Parishioners,

The Catholic Church in the United States has just finished a three-year Eucharistic Revival. The climactic moment occurred earlier this summer in Indianapolis when over 55,000 Catholics entered several powerful days of inspiring preaching and transformative Eucharistic Worship. The ongoing goal of this Eucharistic Revival is to transform Catholics into Eucharistic Missionaries: people who encounter the Lord of the universe who died and rose for them, and who transforms them and inspires them to share the fruit of their Eucharistic encounters with others.

I love celebrating the Eucharist with you. I want to do everything in my power supplemented by God's grace to celebrate the Eucharist in an inspiring way. I want to do everything in my power to facilitate Eucharistic Encounters that form the people of Saint John Fisher Church and create within them a desire to become Eucharistic Missionaries.

Five years have passed by since you, the parishioners of Saint John Fisher Church, "Raised the Roof" of Saint John Fisher Church and converted it into a truly beautiful place to encounter our Eucharistic Lord. We are once again called to "Raise the Roof" in our own lives by converting ourselves into Eucharistic Missionaries who seek to encounter Jesus' life transforming touch and by generously sharing this fruit with others that we encounter. When you bear the fruit of having been with Jesus (joy, peace, love, kindness, generosity, patience, temperance and courage), people see what you have become, and they desire and seek to share in your joyfulness. When we encounter our Eucharistic Lord, we encounter one who made Himself poor so that we could become rich (2 Corinthians 8:9). We encounter One who gave Himself fully. We in turn are inspired to more generously give ourselves to Him. This gift of ourselves includes financial support of our parish.
