

Home and Community Care Support Services (HCCSS) Kevin Babulic -Director. Patient Services



- -This summer, HCCSS will change its name to Ontario Health at Home.
- Since HCCSS efforts to standardize services across the province, there has been a substantial increase in referrals (in some cases 3 or more times the previous amount) from HCCSS to CSS, particularly in the areas of CSS PSS, Respite, and ALS-HRS.
- Kevin is working with HCCSS Business Intelligence to provide CCSN (Nathalie) with monthly data from HPG (the Health Partner Gateway), to monitor the increase in referrals and in turn, the impact on clients and CSS providers.
- CSS providers acknowledged this increase in referrals is very concerning to clients, providers, and the system in general and results in a reduction of access and flow. Further conversation is planned with Leah Barlett, OH East Access and Flow Lead.
- appreciation was expressed for the sharing of this data as it demonstrates the need for additional investment in CSS services, and how many more people could be supported longer in community, if CSS had the capacity to readily accept these referrals, rather than putting

them on a waitlist. ALC numbers would also be reduced with further investment in CSS services.

Data sources include: HPG, CCSN e-Referral (Caredove), and data with Attendant Care service Providers (who continue to receive referrals directly from HCCSS, rather than via either HPG or Caredove).

- the importance of service providers continuing to refer to the most appropriate client services regardless of waitlists was stressed, as this is essential to accurately demonstrate areas of need within the system. However, referrals must be accompanied by the acknowledgement that waitlists are long and growing, so that clients do not expect immediate assistance. Those clients requiring immediate assistance must be clearly identified to enable collaboration among health providers to address their needs in as timely a manner as possible.

- Ontario Community Support Association (OCSA) Patrick Boily Director of Policy.
- -Conference abstracts were received, so thanks to all who submitted. We are reviewing and checking these. If you have missed our call for abstracts, there will be a call for virtual poster presentations. Watch for details to follow soon. Keynotes & speakers have been secured. Details to soon be released!
- CSS strategic **network engagement** piece noted in the most recent OCSA Bulletin. OCSA will be working with Santis Health to bring all the regional networks together & determine how OCSA can better engage with them, understand the roles of the networks, and determine how the association can best interface with the networks.
- -re: advocacy work, OCSA have been working with the province on their regulatory proposals for Ontario Health Teams. OCSA to provide feedback on submission when available. Consulted with members, Board members, members of the Policy Committee re: feedback. Encouraged anyone with ideas on how OCSA might get broader feedback to contact Patrick.

OCSA's Advocacy re: supporting the agreement between the Federal government and the Province of Ontario to move forward has been focused on keeping the money flowing beyond this year, as much of the funding announced relates to previous announcements. OCSA is advocating to allow some of the monies targeted for wages to include support for Volunteer initiatives. Ontario Health East (OHE) Kasia Luebke, Shannon Gesualdo -System System Strategy and planning: Strategy, Planning, Design & Implementation Ontario Health East, Navid -Ontario Health are focusing on Assisted Living Services across the Nabavi- Lead, Performance, Accountability and Funding Allocation Ontario province. By the end of this week, a survey link will be sent to all assisted Health East & Leah Bartlett from TAP team Updates living service providers to help identify future potential funding opportunities to add additional assisted living capacity across Ontario. The survey is broken down by subpopulation, e.g., vulnerable seniors, ABI, HIV, AIDS and adults with physical disabilities. If you have questions, please reach out to Shannon Gesualdo or Navid Nabavi at Ontario Health. -Ontario Health is hosting a **series of webinars** to support providers across the province in implementing the 'new' ALS-HRS Policy that was released last summer. There is a central Hub website where the recorded webinars and a FAQ document is housed. ALS website hub: Assisted Living Services Policy 2023 - Home & Community Support Innovation Centre (hccinnovationcentre.ca) OHE CSS Advisory Table Update: Welcomed a new patent family advisory member to the group. So, there are now two patent family advisors sitting at the table, along with CSS providers from the three regions of Ontario Health East. Last month, there was a presentation on ALC (Alternate Levels of Care), and the group heard from Nathalie on engagement sessions with CSS providers in Central and Southeast regions.

Access and Flow:

Access and Flow meeting tomorrow. Province focused on ALC reduction, something that CSS has a substantial role in affecting. CSS agencies that were provided with ALC reduction project monies at the end of last year were encouraged to continue their initiatives. If unsure of whether your agency/project was funded for one of these initiatives, clarify with your agency's OH lead or contact Navid Nabavi.

<u>Operational Direction</u>: <u>Priorities for Spring/Summer 2024 (extract)</u>:

Community support services providers:

- 1. Participate in regional tables and structures (e.g., access and flow tables) to foster collaboration and increase awareness of supports available.
- 2. Ensure local partners, including hospitals and HCCSS, are aware of existing capacity.

<u>Accountability and Funding Allocation Ontario Health East:</u>

There will be no 'new' MSAAs issued to CSS Providers this year, but rather, simply extension letters based on last year's figures. e-Referral Procurement Process:

Amir Afkham-Ebrahimi announced that the province was amidst a procurement process for all health sectors (including CSS) for an E-referral solution up to four vendor records that will be selected through the process. This is why OH have put a pause on some activities related to the onboarding of new users.

The ADP group is currently working with Central East to review best practices in both regions to update current documentation as needed. Plan to have regional service networks also explore evaluation frameworks and discuss KPI's as efforts move forward.



Chantal shared some e-Referral data for the fiscal year 2023/2024 noting the top referrer as HCCSS & top service recipients as: DSORC, Service Communautaire Prescott-Russell, GlenStorDun Lodge, EOCRC, SEOCHC. The top services requested were noted as: MOW & Housekeeping. Data demonstrates an increase of 19% re: e-Referrals through Caredove from 2022-23 to 2023-24.

Discussed workflow, stressing the importance of ensuring someone is always assigned to open all referrals received through Caredove and the referral process is completed to the point of 'closure' so that the referrer receives notice of the outcome of their referral. Data indicates that there are currently 1.8 % referrals unopened. CSS Providers encouraged CCSN to notify them if referrals should remain unopened for an extended period of time so that they can respond to this at their end as needed. CCSN plan to offer some refresher Training sessions on the use of Caredove this fall and encouraged CSS Providers to participate. If needing training before the fall, providers were encouraged to let CCSN know.

Change Advisory Board (CAB) / Shared Services Operation (SSO)

The RFP process to identify a vendor of record is well underway and on track. Deadline for submission soon, with review process to get underway. 80% of SSO agencies across Champlain have signed a letter of intent to participate in this process. CCSN have been followed up with the 20% of providers who have not signed on and anticipate that once a vendor of choice is recommended, more may become involved. All involved in this process were extended kudos for their time and shared experience. The result will be a fulsome package of vendor information that can be shared with CSS Agencies/Boards of all involved as they move forward with decisions on a new client information system.

Age Well at Home initiative - Kayla Menkhorst, Eganville & District Seniors	Innovative funding initiative reaching out to people in rural regions of Renfrew County: Federal government grant of \$800,000 for a 2-year period under the Age Well at Home funding initiative. Working in partnership with Barry's Bay and Area Home Support, Seniors in the Township of Whitewater Region and the Algonquins of Pikwakanagan to streamline gaps in CSS services by reaching out to previously difficult to serve rural areas. "It is all about reaching people and making sure they get services in these rural areas that encompass a breadth of 4700 square Kilometers". Food stability & home making are the main focus of this project. Homemakers and support workers have been hired from within the communities being served to provide both homemaking (including meal preparation) and outside yardwork. Other food programming being explored: cooking classes (focusing on meal prep for one or two people), community dinners, developing/modifying volunteer roles (using tips acquired from CCSN Volunteer Management Training).	

	Navigators have been hired, who are aware of these communities to support those seeking assistance. Partnering with Algonquins of Pikwakanagan will enable AWAH project to provide culturally appropriate services for Indigenous People who live outside of the First Nations community in other regions of Renfrew County. All activities are being documented to make sure that data is available to support a sustainability plan once the funding is no longer available. In the meantime, a substantial number of seniors are being supported in their own communities that were previously unable to be served.
Ottawa Hospice/Palliative Care – Jennifer Lockyer	New Francophone services The new Francophone 8 bed hospice near Montfort Hospital on Montreal Road is to open in June and include a day program on site and in-home volunteer support.
	Programs are available free of charge for people residing both in and outside of Ottawa, living with a life limiting illness. If outside of Ottawa, clients must arrange transportation for themselves.
Aging Well Exhibition in Cornwall - Phyllis Burtenshaw-	There will be an open house on May 22 nd to see the facilities. Invites were sent out, but if anyone interested, please reach to "Jennifer Lockyer: Jennifer.Lockyer@hospicecareottawa.ca"
