



Where to find prospects



Your network

Board, colleagues, partners, former coworkers, relatives.



Foundations comms

Examples: Ontario Trillium Foundation; McConnell Foundation; Laidlaw Foundation.



Government comms

Both from departments or elected representatives. Federal, Provincial or Municipal!

Where to find prospects (pt.2)



Examples: Grant Connect and Grant Station; Environment Funders Canada.

Similar organizations as yours

Check-out their website, annual reports, etc.

P.S: Don't try to "steal" your partners funders though, unless they give you the green light :)

Diving deeper into grant-writing

Common questions in grant proposals

Outline: Project description in about 100 words. (What sets the organization/project apart)

What are the key project activities that you will complete to successfully implement the project?

Explain the needs the project is expected to tackle.

Explain how the organization has the capacity to execute the project successfully. Include details about the expertise of the project team.

How will you ensure your project lives by the "nothing about us without us" motto?

How will you integrate Diversity, Equity and Inclusion into your project?

Is the project intended to continue after the requested grant comes to an end? If yes, explain the financial sustainability plan for subsequent years.

Request amount and Budget of the project

Where will the project take place and what's the demographic you serve.

Impact: "What impact has you project had in the past and/or how will measure success going forward?".

Focus on outcomes.

If you intend for the project to scale up in the future, please explain the expansion plans.

Al: how to leverage it

Final Activity:

Choose one more grant questions and come up with an answer for it.
