CHIASSON TABBED AS CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD FOR THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF PORT AUTHORITIES

Longtime Greater Lafourche Port Commission (GLPC) Executive Director Chett Chiasson has become the newest American Association of Port Authorities (AAPA) Chairman of the Board.

The announcement was made during the opening ceremonies of the 113th AAPA Annual Convention in Boston in early November.

In his role, Chiasson and the board he chairs will be charged with representing more than 130 public port authorities in the U.S., Canada, the Caribbean, and Latin America.

Chiasson, who previously served on the AAPA Board of Directors and most recently as Vice Chair, said that it is an honor to follow in the footsteps of those who came before him, such as outgoing Chair Paul Anderson.

Anderson is the President and CEO of Port Tampa Bay.

"Having the opportunity to be involved with such an amazing and talented group of port leaders is humbling to say the least,"

Chiasson said. "Individuals like Paul and others involved in AAPA are held in high regard, and for good reason, as they play an active role in shaping maritime policy that keeps our port community vibrant and on solid footing each and every day."

During his acceptance speech after being formally elected by his board colleagues and the organization's general membership, Chiasson said, "While our individual stories may differ, they also have a lot of overlap. I intend to continue to be part of and help enhance what AAPA is doing to tell our stories as a national industry to Capitol Hill, the Administration, and anyone who will listen."

Chiasson has been with GLPC for 19 years, having been the Executive Director since 2010.

With the support of a nine-member elected Board of Commissioners, Chiasson has played an important leadership role in working to protect Port Fourchon and Louisiana's surrounding coast. He, with the help of the Board, have also worked to stress the importance of servicing the ever-expanding energy industry for local, state, and national economies, alongside U.S. energy security.

"I want to express my sincerest gratitude to my own board for their guidance and faith in me," Chiasson said. "They truly are an asset to their community and are the driving force behind all the amazing things we do in Port Fourchon day in and day out."

Chiasson's two-year term as AAPA Chairman of the Board has commenced, and he will serve in this role until 2026.

The prominence and importance of our port cannot be understated or underestimated as we field inquiries, sign new leases, and participate in tours and interviews on a regular basis.

The Coastal Wetlands Park is a one-of-a-kind project where dredged materials from an adjacent slip filled an area of more than 100 acres.

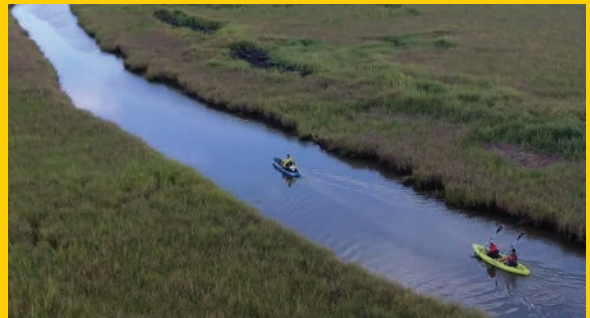
The open water footprint was transformed and becomes complete with a meandering tidal creek and wharf, the



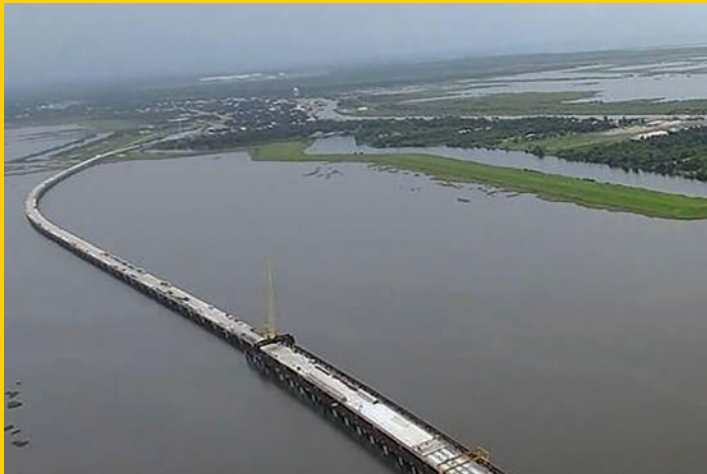
perfect spot for someone to launch a kayak or non-motorized boat and enjoy an immersive experience in an actual mitigation area.

PHASE 2 CONSTRUCTION**



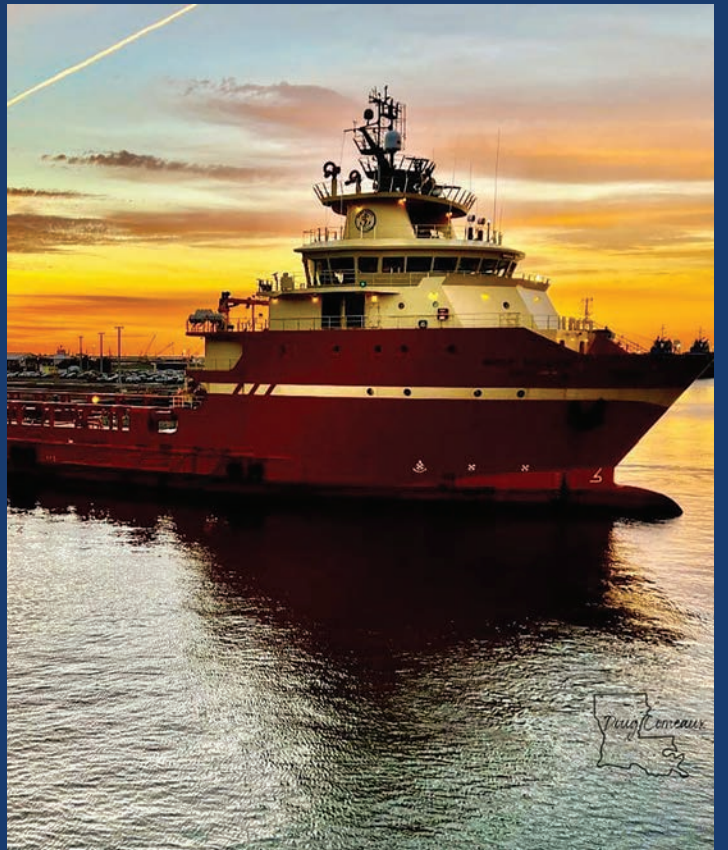
