**Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE**

Like many of us "lost sheep", we can identify with Jesus analogy of the sheep gate. Upon reconverting, after many years away from the faith, the Catholic Church becomes a safe haven for those once lost. When away from living in tune with God's plan, we become drifters, isolated and disconnected. Of course, sinning is fun, irresponsible and seemingly hurts no one but ourselves. This wrong thinking allows us to get "around" all those moral commandments, rules and virtues. Upon rediscovering the rightness of following Our Lord, we begin to see things fall into place. We live the best version of ourselves and live it more abundantly. We realize that we are happier having those guidelines in which to live. We see the wisdom of following God the Shepherd's plan for us sheep. We see the positive symbolism of the sheep gate as Jesus is the exclusive access point to eternal salvation, safety and spiritual nourishment. He acts as the protective entrance to the fold, deflecting harm from us and nourishing security. He gently invites us to pasture with him, experiencing spiritual fulfillment while striving for salvation. Like sheep, we recognize the voice of God calling us, even when blind and lost. And lastly, when lambs were to be sacrificed in Jerusalem temples, they were led in through the sheep gate. This solidifies Jesus as the ultimate sacrificial lamb of God.

**Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE**

Al igual que muchas de nosotros, «ovejas perdidas», podemos identificarnos con la analogía de Jesús sobre la puerta de las ovejas. Al reconvertirnos —tras muchos años alejados de la fe—, la Iglesia Católica se convierte en un refugio seguro para aquellos que alguna vez estuvieron perdidos. Cuando vivimos apartados y fuera de sintonía con el plan de Dios, nos convertimos en seres a la deriva, aislados y desconectados. Por supuesto, pecar resulta divertido, irresponsable y, en apariencia, no daña a nadie más que a nosotros mismos. Este pensamiento erróneo nos permite «eludir» todos esos mandamientos morales, normas y virtudes. Al redescubrir la rectitud que conlleva seguir a Nuestro Señor, comenzamos a ver cómo todo encaja en su lugar. Vivimos la mejor versión de nosotros mismos, y la vivimos con mayor plenitud. Nos damos cuenta de que somos más felices al contar con esas pautas que guían nuestra vida. Percibimos la sabiduría que encierra seguir el plan de Dios —el Pastor— para nosotros, sus ovejas. Vemos el simbolismo positivo de la puerta de las ovejas, pues Jesús constituye el punto de acceso exclusivo hacia la salvación eterna, la seguridad y el alimento espiritual. Él actúa como la entrada protectora del redil, apartando de nosotros todo daño y brindándonos seguridad. Con ternura, nos invita a pastar junto a Él, permitiéndonos experimentar la plenitud espiritual mientras luchamos por alcanzar la salvación. Como ovejas, reconocemos la voz de Dios que nos llama, incluso cuando nos hallamos ciegos y perdidos. Y, por último, cabe recordar que, cuando los corderos iban a ser sacrificados en los templos de Jerusalén, eran conducidos al interior a través de la puerta de las ovejas. Esto reafirma a Jesús como el Cordero de Dios, el sacrificio supremo. «Yo soy el Buen Pastor —dice el Señor—; conozco a mis ovejas, y las mías me conocen a mí».
