Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

Easter is the most significant Christian holiday, celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ three days after his crucifixion. This symbolizes victory over death and sin and stands as our prime belief in Catholicism. It affirms Jesus as Son of God, offering believers salvation and hope in eternal life, which is the foundation of Christian faith. Christ's death and resurrection is the heart of Christianity, validating his identity as the Messiah and Son of God. This was witnessed by many during the 40 days after Christ's resurrection. But most significant was the first witness was a woman of questionable reputation, having had seven demons expelled from her. She was mistakenly reputed to be a repentant prostitute by Pope Gregory the Great in 591, who conflated a sinner with Mary of Bethany. However, the Catholic Church officially corrected this in 1969, stating there was no biblical support for this notion. The remarkable thing about Mary Magdalene is she became the "apostle to the apostles". She brought the disciples the good news of Jesus' resurrection, much to their amazement. Women in ancient times were not regarded as reliable witnesses with valid testimonies, so her testimony required Peter and John to verify the news. In first century, Jewish culture, her role as the first witness is considered to be a strong piece of historical evidence that the account was not invented. Further her bravery was evident as she stayed at the foot of the cross, when most of the male disciples had fled. Only the apostles encounter with the risen Christ freed them from their paralysis manifesting in them an enthusiastic zeal in following Our Lord.

Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE

La Pascua es la festividad cristiana más significativa, pues celebra la resurrección de Jesucristo tres días después de su crucifixión. Esto simboliza la victoria sobre la muerte y el pecado, y constituye nuestra creencia primordial en el catolicismo. Afirma a Jesús como Hijo de Dios, ofreciendo a los creyentes la salvación y la esperanza en la vida eterna, lo cual es el fundamento de la fe cristiana. La muerte y resurrección de Cristo son el corazón del cristianismo, validando su identidad como el Mesías y el Hijo de Dios. Este acontecimiento fue presenciado por muchos durante los 40 días posteriores a la resurrección de Cristo. Pero lo más significativo es que la primera testigo fue una mujer de reputación cuestionable, de quien se habían expulsado siete demonios. Fue considerada erróneamente como una prostituta arrepentida por el Papa Gregorio Magno en el año 591, quien confundió a una pecadora con María de Betania. Sin embargo, la Iglesia Católica corrigió oficialmente este error en 1969, declarando que no existía respaldo bíblico para tal noción. Lo extraordinario de María Magdalena es que se convirtió en la «apóstol de los apóstoles». Ella llevó a los discípulos la buena nueva de la resurrección de Jesús, ante el gran asombro de ellos. En la antigüedad, las mujeres no eran consideradas testigos fiables ni sus testimonios se estimaban válidos; por ello, su testimonio requirió que Pedro y Juan verificaran la noticia. En la cultura judía del siglo I, su papel como primera testigo se considera una sólida prueba histórica de que el relato no fue inventado. Además, su valentía resultó evidente al permanecer al pie de la cruz, mientras que la mayoría de los discípulos varones habían huido. Solo el encuentro de los apóstoles con Cristo resucitado los liberó de su parálisis, suscitando en ellos un celo entusiasta en el seguimiento de Nuestro Señor.

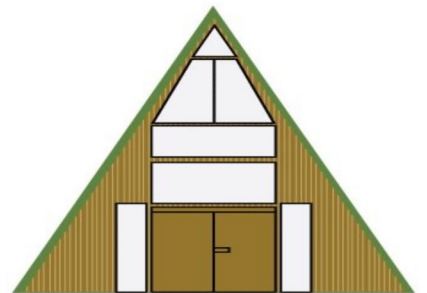
