Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

Baptism for all of us is a symbolic cleansing from sin, spiritual rebirth and reception of the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. It marks a new life in Christ and entry into the Christian community. So why would Jesus submit Himself to this procedure if He was without sin? Our Messiah identifies with us sinners as an act of humility, modeling the remission of sins for our sake. We receive the same spirit as Jesus at both Baptism and Confirmation: "This is my beloved son or daughter, with whom I am well pleased." It is a gateway to deeper Catholic life, offering divine grace, forgiveness and guidance from the Holy Spirit. It makes each one of us a unique child of God. It is not just a good feeling. It is a spiritual reality confirmed by inner peace and external Godly living. The feast of the Lord's Baptism is known as Theophany, commemorating Christ's baptism in the River Jordan. The Christmas season was thought to end with the Epiphany, celebrated last Sunday, but now it concludes with the Baptism of the Lord. It is a natural sequence, that once born, we begin a new life, which Baptism brings. This is further solidified in Confirmation with a deeper desire for God and His Word. We can recognize a transformed character within ourselves of greater love, joy and peace. We can speak out boldly in faith; our actions are changed to serve others. We have an inner confidence of our own salvation and a new ability to overcome sin. We can manifest the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. Let us thank God for this sacrament of Initiation, this covenant allowing us to decide for Christ, who has already decided for us.

Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE

El bautismo es para todos nosotros una purificación simbólica del pecado, un renacimiento espiritual y la recepción de la presencia del Espíritu Santo. Marca una nueva vida en Cristo y la entrada en la comunidad cristiana. Entonces, ¿por qué Jesús se sometió a este rito si no tenía pecado? Nuestro Mesías se identifica con nosotros, pecadores, en un acto de humildad, modelando la remisión de los pecados por nosotros. Recibimos el mismo Espíritu que Jesús tanto en el Bautismo como en la Confirmación: «Este es mi hijo amado, en quien tengo complacencia». Es la puerta de entrada a una vida católica más profunda, que ofrece la gracia divina, el perdón y la guía del Espíritu Santo. Nos convierte a cada uno de nosotros en hijos únicos de Dios. No es solo una buena sensación, sino una realidad espiritual confirmada por la paz interior y una vida piadosa. La fiesta del Bautismo del Señor se conoce como Epifanía, que conmemora el bautismo de Cristo en el río Jordán. Se pensaba que la temporada navideña terminaba con la Epifanía, celebra el domingo pasado, pero ahora concluye con el Bautismo del Señor. Es una secuencia natural: una vez nacidos, comenzamos una nueva vida, que el Bautismo nos otorga. Esto se consolida aún más en la Confirmación con un deseo más profundo de Dios y de su Palabra. Podemos reconocer en nosotros mismos un carácter transformado, con mayor amor, alegría y paz. Podemos hablar con valentía en la fe; nuestras acciones cambian para servir a los demás. Tenemos una confianza interior en nuestra propia salvación y una nueva capacidad para vencer el pecado. Podemos manifestar los dones y frutos del Espíritu Santo. Demos gracias a Dios por este sacramento de Iniciación, esta alianza que nos permite decidir por Cristo, quien ya ha decidido por nosotros.
