Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

The second Sunday in Ordinary Time marks the start of the Church's focus on Jesus' public ministry after Christmas. Our attention is centered on readings that highlight Our Lord's first miracles, the selection of disciples or God's abundant grace and gifts. John the Baptist was the first to identify Jesus as the "Lamb of God", which invokes references to the Old Testament. The sacrifice of Passover when Israel was enslaved by Egypt, was a pure unblemished lamb. The blood of the lamb was painted on the doorpost, thus allowing all those whose house had this marking to be spared. Similarly, we mark our doors with the 3 Kings blessed chalk, which blesses those who pass through the door. Jesus is the new Passover Lamb so that all of humanity can be redeemed by Christ's blood. Our Catechism gives attention to Jesus' choice of the Passover feast as a symbol for what was to happen through his death and Resurrection. As the people of Israel were freed from slavery to Egypt, so does Christ free us from the slavery of sin and the power of death. {CCC 571-573} Christ made himself the sacrificial lamb, thus establishing the definitive connection between God and mankind. When John announced Jesus as the Lamb of God, he signaled his followers to transfer their allegiance to Christ, rather than to himself. John did not want to draw attention to himself, but to Jesus. Like John the Baptist, we are to bring others to Jesus, not draw attention to ourselves.

Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE

El segundo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario marca el inicio del enfoque de la Iglesia en el ministerio público de Jesús después de la Navidad. Nuestra atención se centra en las lecturas que destacan los primeros milagros de Nuestro Señor, la elección de los discípulos o la abundante gracia y los dones de Dios. Juan el Bautista fue el primero en identificar a Jesús como el "Cordero de Dios", lo que evoca referencias al Antiguo Testamento. El sacrificio de la Pascua, cuando Israel estaba esclavizado en Egipto, consistía en un cordero puro e inmaculado. La sangre del cordero se pintaba en el dintel de la puerta, permitiendo así que todos aquellos cuyas casas tuvieran esta marca fueran salvados. De manera similar, marcamos nuestras puertas con la tiza bendecida de los Reyes Magos, que bendice a quienes pasan por ellas. Jesús es el nuevo Cordero Pascual para que toda la humanidad pueda ser redimida por su sangre. Nuestro Catecismo presta atención a la elección de Jesús de la fiesta de la Pascua como símbolo de lo que sucedería a través de su muerte y resurrección. Así como el pueblo de Israel fue liberado de la esclavitud de Egipto, Cristo nos libera de la esclavitud del pecado y del poder de la muerte. {CCC 571-573} Cristo se hizo a sí mismo el cordero sacrificial, estableciendo así la conexión definitiva entre Dios y la humanidad. Cuando Juan anunció a Jesús como el Cordero de Dios, indicó a sus seguidores que transfirieran su lealtad a Cristo, en lugar de a él mismo. Juan no quería llamar la atención sobre sí mismo, sino sobre Jesús. Al igual que Juan el Bautista, debemos llevar a otros a Jesús, no llamar la atención sobre nosotros mismos.
