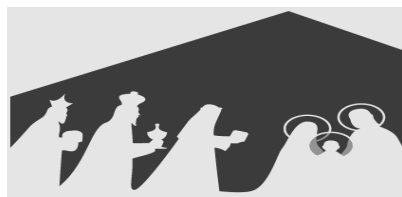

Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

The Christmas season is way too short. With stores advertising before Halloween and sales through Thanksgiving, one would think Christmas is over by Dec.25. Sadly, many pack up their red and green decor the day after and move the tree to the curb. However, the Catholic Church starts Christmas on the 25th. and continues through Jan.6 with the feast of the Epiphany. The Twelve days of Christmas are marked symbolically by the song which boasts of 5 golden rings and a partridge in a pear tree. But in ancient times, many did not read and could not afford books, so the gospel was spread through the symbolism of the song. The first day of Christmas represents God. The second are the Old and New Testaments. The Third day are the Theological virtues of Faith, Hope and Love as well as the Trinity. The Fourth day of Christmas represents the Four Gospels. The Fifth day are the five books of the Pentateuch, or the Old Testament. The sixth day is clearly the six days God created the world and rested on the seventh. The seven days represent the seven gifts of the Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord. Also, one could identify the 7 deadly sins and their 7 counterpart virtues. There are 8 Beatitudes and nine Fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self control. The Tenth day of Christmas is the Ten Commandments. The Eleventh day represents the 11 faithful apostles. And lastly, the Twelve days detail our beliefs in the Apostles Creed. We believe in God, Jesus Christ, Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered, died, and descended to Hell. He ascended to heaven, will come to judge the living and the dead. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Catholic Church, the communion of Saints and forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting.

Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE

La temporada navideña es demasiado corta. Con las tiendas anunciando sus productos antes de Halloween y las rebajas hasta el Día de Acción de Gracias, uno pensaría que la Navidad termina el 25 de diciembre. Lamentablemente, muchos guardan sus adornos rojos y verdes al día siguiente y tiran el árbol a la basura. Sin embargo, la Iglesia Católica comienza la Navidad el 25 de diciembre y la celebra hasta el 6 de enero con la fiesta de la Epifanía. Los Doce Días de Navidad se conmemoran simbólicamente con la canción que menciona cinco anillos de oro y una perdiz en un peral. En la antigüedad, muchas personas no sabían leer ni podían permitirse comprar libros, por lo que el Evangelio se difundía a través del simbolismo de la canción. El primer día de Navidad representa a Dios. El segundo, el Antiguo y el Nuevo Testamento. El tercer día, las virtudes teologales de fe, esperanza y caridad, así como la Santísima Trinidad. El cuarto día de Navidad representa los Cuatro Evangelios. El quinto día, los cinco libros del Pentateuco, o el Antiguo Testamento. El sexto día representa claramente los seis días en que Dios creó el mundo y descansó el séptimo. Los siete días representan los siete dones del Espíritu Santo: sabiduría, entendimiento, consejo, fortaleza, conocimiento, piedad y temor de Dios. También se pueden identificar los siete pecados capitales y sus siete virtudes correspondientes. Hay ocho Bienaventuranzas y nueve frutos del Espíritu Santo: amor, alegría, paz, paciencia, amabilidad, bondad, fidelidad, mansedumbre y dominio propio. El décimo día de Navidad son los Diez Mandamientos. El undécimo día representa a los once apóstoles fieles. Y, por último, los Doce Días detallan nuestras creencias en el Credo de los Apóstoles. Creemos en Dios, en Jesucristo, en el Espíritu Santo, nacido de la Virgen María, que padeció, murió y descendió a los infiernos. Ascendió al cielo y vendrá a juzgar a vivos y muertos. Creemos en el Espíritu Santo, en la Santa Iglesia Católica, en la comunión de los santos, en el perdón de los pecados, en la resurrección de la carne y en la vida eterna.
