**Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE**

Many who come back from a near death experience report their life is changed forever more. They seem to have a new set of priorities and let go of meaningless unimportant things. And so, it must have been for Lazarus who was in the tomb four days before his resurrection. He would have been a tremendous witness for starting our lives over. Jesus intentionally delayed his arrival allowing Lazarus to die so that the miracle would bring greater glory to God. This allowed many to believe in Jesus but instigated the Sanhedrin to plot against him. They feared his growing influence which diminished their own. While Lazarus would die again later, Jesus would be resurrected to eternal life. Our Catechism makes Christ's resurrection as a cornerstone of Christian faith as it highlights the quest and opportunity for all to gain eternal life. This miraculous story symbolizes Jesus calling all of us out of darkness into the light. He calls us away from our sins and into a new life with him. When we trust and are receptive to all the Lord deserves for us, we will live the best version of ourselves. Even when we die, God redeems us body and soul. On the Last Day, he will remake all of creation, and raise us up in the flesh. This means we will be transformed but still experience ourselves in our element. {CCC 1015}

**Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE**

Muchos de quienes regresan de una experiencia cercana a la muerte relatan que su vida ha cambiado para siempre. Parecen haber adoptado un nuevo conjunto de prioridades y se desprenden de cosas insignificantes y sin importancia. Y así debió de haber sido para Lázaro, quien permaneció en el sepulcro durante cuatro días antes de su resurrección. Él habría sido un testimonio extraordinario de lo que significa comenzar la vida de nuevo. Jesús retrasó intencionadamente su llegada, permitiendo que Lázaro muriera, para que el milagro redundara en una mayor gloria para Dios. Esto permitió que muchos creyeran en Jesús, pero incitó al Sanedrín a conspirar contra él. Temían su creciente influencia, la cual mermaba la suya propia. Si bien Lázaro volvería a morir más tarde, Jesús resucitaría para la vida eterna. Nuestro Catecismo establece la resurrección de Cristo como la piedra angular de la fe cristiana, al destacar la búsqueda —y la oportunidad— que todos tenemos de alcanzar la vida eterna. Esta historia milagrosa simboliza el llamado que Jesús nos hace a todos para salir de la oscuridad y entrar en la luz. Él nos llama a apartarnos de nuestros pecados y a emprender una vida nueva junto a él. Cuando confiamos y nos mostramos receptivos a todo lo que el Señor tiene reservado para nosotros, vivimos la mejor versión de nosotros mismos. Incluso cuando morimos, Dios nos redime en cuerpo y alma. En el Último Día, Él renovará toda la creación y nos resucitará en la carne. Esto significa que seremos transformados, pero seguiremos experimentándonos a nosotros mismos en nuestra propia esencia. {CCC 1015}


