Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

As we are still in Easter tide, we can realize why this Fifth Sunday is called Cantate Sunday. This day is named after the opening words of the Introit "Cantate Domino" or Sing to the Lord from Psalm 98. The gospel further echoes the themes of Joy, Faith and Love. We are to obey the new Commandment to love one another, and that Jesus is the way to the Father. He is not only the way but the path to the Father. Jesus is the living corner stone, the very foundation of the true faith. Reflect on Jesus's great teaching that he "is the way, the truth and the life." We are part of God's living Church as his chosen people, even when facing difficulties, or "undeserved" avenues of grace. Life often can feel dark and dangerous, especially in these turbulent times. We may not know the way or even be confused by conflicting messages. But when lost, we need only to ask, "Lord what do you want me to do"? We will know the right path as it will give us peace, whereas other routes do not bring us peace. Our true destination is the Father and Jesus is the way through the Holy Spirit. But how can we truly know Jesus? By participating in the life of Christ through the sacraments. We can study the bible, join prayer groups, avail ourselves of Catholic web sites, Formed.Org and listening to Relevant Radio. We can offer up our sufferings for the redemption of our own soul and those to whom we love. We can study our way to the Lord by reading the early Church Fathers and recognize that from day one, our Catholic Church is the only Church Jesus founded.

Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE

Dado que aún nos encontramos en el tiempo pascual, podemos comprender por qué a este Quinto Domingo se le denomina Domingo "Cantate". Este día recibe su nombre de las palabras iniciales del Introito: «Cantate Domino» —o «Cantad al Señor»—, tomadas del Salmo 98. El Evangelio, por su parte, se hace eco de los temas de la alegría, la fe y el amor. Estamos llamados a obedecer el mandamiento nuevo de amarnos los unos a los otros, reconociendo que Jesús es el camino hacia el Padre. Él no es solo la vía, sino la senda misma que conduce al Padre. Jesús es la piedra angular viviente, el fundamento mismo de la verdadera fe. Reflexionemos sobre la gran enseñanza de Jesús: que Él «es el camino, la verdad y la vida». Somos parte de la Iglesia viva de Dios, su pueblo elegido, incluso cuando afrontamos dificultades o cuando recibimos «inmerecidas» manifestaciones de gracia. A menudo, la vida puede parecer oscura y peligrosa, especialmente en estos tiempos turbulentos. Es posible que no sepamos cuál es el camino, o incluso que nos sintamos confundidos por mensajes contradictorios. Pero, cuando nos sentimos perdidos, basta con que preguntemos: «Señor, ¿qué quieres que haga?». Reconoceremos el camino correcto, pues este nos infundirá paz; las otras rutas, en cambio, no nos la traerán. Nuestro verdadero destino es el Padre, y Jesús es el camino para llegar a Él por medio del Espíritu Santo. Pero, ¿cómo podemos llegar a conocer verdaderamente a Jesús? Participando en la vida de Cristo a través de los sacramentos. Podemos estudiar la Biblia, unirnos a grupos de oración, recurrir a sitios web católicos —como Formed.org— y sintonizar emisoras como "Relevant Radio". Podemos ofrecer nuestros sufrimientos por la redención de nuestra propia alma y por la de aquellos a quienes amamos. Podemos profundizar en nuestro camino hacia el Señor leyendo a los Padres de la Iglesia primitiva y reconociendo que, desde el primer día, nuestra Iglesia Católica es la única Iglesia que Jesús fundó. «Pero, alma mía, si tu fe es firme y vigilante, no podrás negar que, tras esta vida —que se desvanece como una sombra—, si permaneces firme en la fe, la esperanza y el amor, verás a Dios clara y verdaderamente tal como Él es en sí mismo; y lo poseerás y gozarás de Él de un modo mucho más excelso e íntimo que el que ahora experimentas con las cosas creadas».
