Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

The contrast between the two worshipers is stark. The tax collector is humble, stays in the back and begs God for his mercy. The proud Pharisee presumes because he is in a religious sect. that he is somehow better than the tax collector. The Pharisee makes a big show of his faith by thanking God that he is not like the humble tax collector. And so are many of us who presume because we are at mass, that we are righteous and destined for heaven. We pray many rosaries, openly and loudly profess our faith, yet are far from God. We may even look down on those at mass who do not donate to the collection, do not know the correct responses to the liturgy yet continue to ask for God's mercy. The second contrast is in the physical posturing of the two opposing persons. The Pharisee is up front "taking his designated" seat in the temple, while the collector is hanging back, not worthy to lift his eyes to God. The Pharisee states how correct he is in fasting, praying, tithing and 'unlike the rest of humanity.' There is another contrast between the two as most people want to be independent, self-sufficient and take charge of their affairs. We are afraid of being "less than". However, God wants the person who trusts in His mercy to ask for mercy, not just to presume it is given. He loves the person who is not self-sufficient, the one who needs and relies on divine intervention. He loves us in our brokenness, in our wants, and in our struggles. If we are truly self-sufficient, we don't rely on God because we think we can do it all. In fact, we want to control God, dominate the conversation and strive to be fully "independent", not needing God because we can "do it all". Consider how God is calling us to embrace our need for Him?

Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE

El contraste entre los dos adoradores es marcado. El publicano es humilde, se queda atrás y ruega a Dios por su misericordia. El orgulloso fariseo presume, por pertenecer a una secta religiosa, de ser superior al publicano. El fariseo hace alarde de su fe agradeciendo a Dios no ser como el humilde publicano. Y así somos muchos de nosotros, que, por estar en misa, presumemos de ser justos y estar destinados al cielo. Rezamos muchos rosarios, profesamos nuestra fe abierta y en voz alta, pero estamos lejos de Dios. Incluso podemos menospreciar a quienes, en misa, no donan a la colecta, desconocen las respuestas correctas a la liturgia y, sin embargo, siguen pidiendo la misericordia de Dios. El segundo contraste reside en la postura física de las dos personas opuestas. El fariseo está al frente, "ocupando su lugar" en el templo, mientras que el publicano se queda atrás, indigno de alzar la vista hacia Dios. El fariseo afirma lo correcto que es al ayunar, orar, diezmar y ser "diferente del resto de la humanidad". Existe otro contraste entre ambos, ya que la mayoría de la gente desea ser independiente, autosuficiente y hacerse cargo de sus asuntos. Tememos ser "menos que los demás". Sin embargo, Dios quiere que quien confía en su misericordia la pida, no que simplemente la dé por sentada. Ama a quien no es autosuficiente, a quien necesita y depende de la intervención divina. Nos ama en nuestras debilidades, en nuestras necesidades y en nuestras luchas. Si somos verdaderamente autosuficientes, no confiamos en Dios porque creemos que podemos con todo. De hecho, queremos controlar a Dios, dominar la conversación y esforzarnos por ser completamente independientes, sin necesitar a Dios porque podemos con todo. ¿Reflexiona sobre cómo nos llama Dios a aceptar nuestra necesidad de Él?
