Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

We have all been to crowded venues, trying to find an available seat. We may often vey for places of honor, distinguishing ourselves as separate from others. We eventually settle ourselves in the corner or behind a potted plant away from the action. But when the host sees us and says, "Please" come sit by me, we instantly feel honored and valued. And thus, it is with today's gospel. Instead of seeking places of honor at every opportunity, we should humbly sit at a lower place and wait for the host to invite us near him. The word humbly however has a negative connotation in our society. It is regarded as subpar, lower and of little value. The Latin derivation comes from humus or of the ground. In most introductions, the conversation quickly resorts to what a person does for a living, their vocation and background. We make judgements based on talents and possessions, often thinking that humility is not an asset, rather a person is measured in materialistic ways. But in heavenly parlance, the word connotes controlled strength. As each person is given gifts by God, we are precious in his sight. If we are truly humble, we know our gifts and how to use them. In our earthly lives, instead of seeking recognition and honor, we may want to hold out for a later reward. Is it better to have accolades which rust, fade or break or wait for lasting eternal recognition? When we humbly seek the lowest place on earth, heaven will lift us up and raise us to the highest.

Mother Teresa's code of humility: "Accept small irritations with good humor; Speak as little as possible about yourself; Keep busy with your own affairs and not those of others; Avoid curiosity; Do not interfere in the affairs of others; Accept small irritations with good humor; Do not dwell on the faults of others; and Accept censures even if unmerited."

Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE

Todos hemos estado en lugares llenos de gente, buscando un asiento libre. A menudo, buscamos lugares de honor, distinguiéndonos de los demás. Al final, nos acomodamos en un rincón o detrás de una maceta, lejos de la acción. Pero cuando el anfitrión nos ve y dice: "Por favor, siéntate a mi lado", nos sentimos honrados y valorados al instante. Y así sucede con el evangelio de hoy. En lugar de buscar lugares de honor a la menor oportunidad, deberíamos sentarnos humildemente en un lugar más bajo y esperar a que el anfitrión nos invite a acercarnos. Sin embargo, la palabra "humildemente" tiene una connotación negativa en nuestra sociedad. Se considera inferior, inferior y de poco valor. La palabra "humildemente" deriva del latín humus, que significa "de la tierra". En la mayoría de las presentaciones, la conversación gira rápidamente en torno a la profesión de una persona, su vocación y sus antecedentes. Juzgamos según sus talentos y posesiones, pensando a menudo que la humildad no es una cualidad, sino que se mide a una persona en términos materiales. Pero en el lenguaje divino, la palabra connota fuerza controlada. Como cada persona recibe dones de Dios, somos preciosos a sus ojos. Si somos verdaderamente humildes, conocemos nuestros dones y sabemos cómo usarlos. En nuestra vida terrenal, en lugar de buscar reconocimiento y honor, quizás queremos esperar una recompensa futura. ¿Es mejor tener elogios que se oxidan, se desvanecen o se rompen, o esperar un reconocimiento eterno y duradero? Cuando humildemente buscamos el lugar más bajo de la tierra, el cielo nos elevará y nos elevará a lo más alto. El código de humildad de la Madre Teresa: «Acepta las pequeñas irritaciones con buen humor; habla lo menos posible de ti mismo; ocúpate de tus propios asuntos y no de los de los demás; evita la curiosidad; no te inmiscuyas en los asuntos de los demás; acepta las pequeñas irritaciones con buen humor; no te detengas en las faltas de los demás; y acepta las censuras, aunque sean inmerecidas».
