Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

Fighting over inheritances causes many long-lasting family disputes. My wise mother, started giving away her material goods years before she needed to. Her idea was to avoid any dissension once she was no longer here. It worked well with the family getting something each really wanted while mom was around to see us enjoy it. But many families are not able to divide property evenly with one thinking they deserve more and seeking legal help to get what they want. Such is the gospel this week between brothers disputing the division of a material inheritance. The point of Christ's explanation is that we should not be building up earthly wealth, rather we should be building spiritual wealth. Earthly wealth is fleeting, transitory and can distract us from what is truly worth pursuing. If we store up heavenly treasure, we can enjoy it all the more in the afterlife. But building up material wealth on earth, is futile as we may not live long enough to enjoy it. Those who want to amass land, property, money, furniture, cars, houses or clothes simply will leave it all behind upon death. In fact, all the wealth one acquires during life is given to another at death who did not work to earn it. There is an old joke that no trailer ever follows a hearse. Whereas if we acquire spiritual wealth in the form of prayers, novenas, masses offered, rosaries, charitable donations, support of the church and working for Corporal and Spiritual works of Mercy, we will ultimately benefit. Likewise, we can attend daily mass, adoration and frequent Confession. The more we practice using these gifts of our faith, the more spiritual treasure we can store. Corporal works of mercy: Feed the hungry; clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, visit the sick and imprisoned and bury the dead. Spiritual works: Instruct the ignorant counsel the doubtful, comfort the sorrowful, admonish the sinner bear wrongs patiently, forgive all injuries and pray for the living and the dead.

Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE

Las peleas por herencias causan muchas disputas familiares duraderas. Mi sabia madre empezó a regalar sus bienes materiales años antes de que fuera necesario. Su idea era evitar cualquier disensión una vez que ella ya no estuviera. Funcionó bien, ya que la familia recibía algo que cada uno realmente deseaba mientras mamá estaba presente para vernos disfrutarlo. Pero muchas familias no pueden dividir la propiedad equitativamente, y uno de ellos cree que merece más y busca ayuda legal para conseguir lo que quiere. Este es el evangelio de esta semana entre hermanos que disputan la división de una herencia material. La clave de la explicación de Cristo es que no debemos acumular riqueza terrenal, sino riqueza espiritual. La riqueza terrenal es fugaz, transitoria y puede distraernos de lo que realmente vale la pena perseguir. Si atesoramos tesoros celestiales, podremos disfrutarlos aún más en la otra vida. Pero acumular riqueza material en la tierra es inútil, ya que puede que no vivamos lo suficiente para disfrutarla. Quienes quieren acumular tierras, propiedades, dinero, muebles, autos, casas o ropa simplemente lo dejarán todo atrás al morir. De hecho, toda la riqueza que uno adquiere en vida se entrega al morir a otra persona que no trabajó para ganarla. Hay un viejo chiste que dice que ningún remolque sigue a un coche fúnebre. En cambio, si adquirimos riqueza espiritual mediante oraciones, novenas, misas, rosarios, donaciones caritativas, apoyo a la iglesia y trabajo en obras de misericordia corporales y espirituales, nos beneficiaremos. Asimismo, podemos asistir a misa diario, a la adoración y a la confesión frecuente. Cuanto más practiquemos estos dones de nuestra fe, más tesoro espiritual podremos acumular. Obras de misericordia corporales: alimentar al hambriento; vestir al desnudo; dar cobijo al desamparado; visitar a los enfermos y presos; y enterrar a los muertos. Obras espirituales: instruir al ignorante; aconsejar al que duda; consolar al afligido; amonestar al pecador; sopor tar las ofensas con paciencia; perdonar todas las ofensas y orar por los vivos y los muertos.
