Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

The readings and gospel all point to the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Christ states "just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." From the First Reading of healing those stricken by the serpent to those healed by Christ's death, the cross brings new life to all. This exaltation is a Christian feast day that celebrates the cross as a symbol of Christ's victory over sin and death. It is a beacon of hope and salvation which honors Jesus's sacrifice and the historical significance of St. Helen's discovery of the True Cross on Sept. 14, 326AD. The symbolism does not end there, we believers are called to embrace our own crosses of struggle and sacrifice. We are to take up our burdens with faith and self denial in imitation of Christ. Today's feast day is a symbol of Christian faith; therefore, the cross represents Christ's victory over death. The feast celebrates the redemptive quality of an instrument of torture into a divine tree of life that brings hope to mankind. But what is the difference between a Protestant cross and a Catholic crucifix? Our Protestant brothers and sisters will say their cross is empty because Christ has risen. But Catholics realize without a corpus on the cross, there is no sacrifice. Without a man sacrificing for our sins, there is no salvation on an empty cross. Our Catechism says that Christ lovingly chose the cross so as to bear the guilt and pain of the world. So, by his perfect love, Jesus brought (redeemed) the world back home to God.

"His death on the Cross is the culmination of that turning of God against himself in which he gives himself in order to raise man up and save him. This is love in its most radical form." Emeritus Pope Benedict XVI

Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE

Tanto las lecturas como el evangelio apuntan a la Exaltación de la Santa Cruz. Cristo afirma: «Así como Moisés levantó la serpiente en el desierto, así es necesario que el Hijo del Hombre sea levantado, para que todo el que crea en él tenga vida eterna». Desde la primera lectura, que narra la curación de los heridos por la serpiente hasta la sanación de la muerte de Cristo, la cruz trae nueva vida a todos. Esta exaltación es una festividad cristiana que celebra la cruz como símbolo de la victoria de Cristo sobre el pecado y la muerte. Es un faro de esperanza y salvación que honra el sacrificio de Jesús y la importancia histórica del descubrimiento de la Vera Cruz por Santa Elena el 14 de septiembre del año 326 d. C. El simbolismo no termina ahí; los creyentes estamos llamados a abrazar nuestras propias cruces de lucha y sacrificio. Debemos asumir nuestras cargas con fe y abnegación, imitando a Cristo. La festividad de hoy es un símbolo de la fe cristiana; por lo tanto, la cruz representa la victoria de Cristo sobre la muerte. La fiesta celebra la cualidad redentora de un instrumento de tortura convertido en un árbol divino de vida que trae esperanza a la humanidad. Pero ¿cuál es la diferencia entre una cruz protestante y un crucifijo católico? Nuestros hermanos y hermanas protestantes dirán que su cruz está vacía porque Cristo resucitó. Pero los católicos comprenden que, sin un cuerpo en la cruz, no hay sacrificio. Sin un hombre que se sacrifique por nuestros pecados, no hay salvación en una cruz vacía. Nuestro Catecismo dice que Cristo eligió amorosamente la cruz para cargar con la culpa y el dolor del mundo. Así, por su amor perfecto, Jesús trajo (redimió) al mundo de vuelta a Dios.

"Su muerte en la cruz es la culminación de esa rebelión de Dios contra sí mismo, en la que se entrega para elevar al hombre y salvarlo. Este es el amor en su forma más radical." Papa Emérito Benedicto XVI
