Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

Today's gospel again speaks to the problem of how we spend our time on earth. Last week, we discussed distributing our wealth equitably so that we are good stewards of what God has given us. However, many decline to distribute their "loaned" wealth, preferring to hoard and assume this money belongs just to them. And so again, Jesus tells a story (parable) of how a rich man held onto to his wealth, thinking it was rightfully his. This rich man stepped over the begging Lazarus daily as if he was not a human being asking for help. Despite knowing Lazarus' name, the rich man ignored the juxtaposition of his wealth and the dire circumstances of the poor Lazarus, with dogs licking his wounds. When both died, the rich man in hell, demanded that Lazarus dip his finger in water to cool the burning flames. When that did not work, the rich man asked Abraham to send Lazarus to his remaining brothers alerting them to avoid hell. But Abraham again refused, saying that if his brothers did not listen to Moses and the prophets, they likely would not listen to Lazarus either. So, in this lesson, we need to think of who the Lazarus' are in our lives. Who would benefit from a kind word or deed from us? Who do we repeatedly see and ignore, despite knowing that they need help? Even a smile towards those less fortunate can mean all the difference. Let us be generous in giving a kind word or deed to those around us.

El evangelio de hoy vuelve a abordar el problema de cómo invertimos nuestro tiempo en la tierra. La semana pasada, hablamos sobre cómo distribuir nuestra riqueza equitativamente para ser buenos administradores de lo que Dios nos ha dado. Sin embargo, muchos se niegan a distribuir su riqueza "prestada", prefiriendo acumularla y asumir que este dinero les pertenece solo a ellos. Así, Jesús vuelve a contar una historia (parábola) sobre cómo un hombre rico se aferró a su riqueza, creyendo que le pertenecía por derecho. Este hombre rico pisoteaba a diario a Lázaro, que mendigaba, como si no fuera un ser humano que pedía ayuda. A pesar de conocer el nombre de Lázaro, el hombre rico ignoró la juxtaposición de su riqueza con la terrible situación del pobre Lázaro, con los perros lamándole las heridas. Cuando ambos murieron, el hombre rico, en el infierno, exigió que Lázaro mojara su dedo en agua para apagar las llamas. Al no funcionar, el hombre rico le pidió a Abraham que enviara a Lázaro con sus hermanos restantes, alertándolos para que evitaran el infierno. Pero Abraham se negó de nuevo, diciendo que si sus hermanos no escuchaban a Moisés y a los profetas, probablemente tampoco escucharían a Lázaro. Así que, en esta lección, debemos pensar en quiénes son los Lázaros en nuestras vidas. ¿Quién se beneficiaría de una palabra o un gesto amable de nuestra parte? ¿A quién vemos e ignoramos repetidamente, a pesar de saber que necesita ayuda? Incluso una sonrisa hacia los menos afortunados puede marcar la diferencia. Seamos generosos al dar una palabra o un gesto amable a quienes nos rodean. "Saca tu fuerza simplemente de tu alegría en Jesús. Sé feliz y tranquilo. Acepta lo que te da y da lo que te quita, con una gran sonrisa."
