Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

"If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." This sounds like such a contradiction from the commandment to "love our neighbor as ourselves". Surely Our Lord is misconstruing the meaning of this statement? Surely the Lord would not discount our families as second best? No, the Lord is saying we must place Him above all the rest. We must put Him in first place above family, friends, acquaintances, possessions, leisure pursuits and desires. Wow this is another hard saying because these human ties make our lives richer and more meaningful. Yet we would not have these blessings if the Lord had not provided us with them. So, we can not discount this message. When we place Our Lord in first place, everything else falls into perspective and in its correct place. We must renounce our preference for family, spouses, possessions, desires and not continue to divide our loyalties, which makes God second choice. The past few gospels echo this same refrain: we will attain heaven only by picking up our crosses and entering through the narrow gate. The hard saying that crosses must be expected, tolerated and borne with grace and acceptance is tough. Entering through the narrow gate means we don't do things the way the world desires, but rather the way God desires. We always have a choice between following the way of the world or the way of Our Lord. It helps to remember that in discipleship, Christ only gives crosses to those that are his own. So again, we may choose to accept these crosses or turn away from them. Our Catechism says in faith we can accept our own suffering and share the suffering of others. In this way human suffering becomes united with the redeeming love of Christ and thus part of the divine power that changes the world for the better.

Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE

«Si alguno viene a mí y no aborrece a su padre y madre, a su mujer y a sus hijos, a sus hermanos y hermanas, e incluso a su propia vida, no puede ser mi discípulo». Esto suena a una contradicción con el mandamiento de «amar al prójimo como a nosotros mismos». ¿Acaso nuestro Señor malinterpreta el significado de esta afirmación? ¿Acaso el Señor no descartaría a nuestras familias como algo secundario? No, el Señor dice que debemos ponerlo a Él por encima de todo lo demás. Debemos ponerlo en primer lugar, por encima de la familia, los amigos, los conocidos, las posesiones, las actividades de ocio y los deseos. Vaya, esta es otra afirmación difícil, porque estos lazos humanos enriquecen y dan sentido a nuestras vidas. Sin embargo, no tendríamos estas bendiciones si el Señor no nos las hubiera dado. Por lo tanto, no podemos ignorar este mensaje. Cuando ponemos a nuestro Señor en primer lugar, todo lo demás cobra perspectiva y se sitúa en su lugar. Debemos renunciar a nuestra preferencia por la familia, el cónyuge, las posesiones y los deseos, y no seguir dividiendo nuestras lealtades, lo que convierte a Dios en una segunda opción. Los últimos evangelios hacen eco de este mismo estribillo: alcanzaremos el cielo solo tomando nuestras cruces y entrando por la puerta estrecha. La dura afirmación de que las cruces deben esperarse, tolerarse y sobrellevarse con gracia y aceptación es dura. Entrar por la puerta estrecha significa que no hacemos las cosas como el mundo desea, sino como Dios desea. Siempre podemos elegir entre seguir el camino del mundo o el camino de Nuestro Señor. Es útil recordar que, en el discipulado, Cristo solo da cruces a los suyos. Así que, de nuevo, podemos elegir aceptar estas cruces o alejarnos de ellas. Nuestro Catecismo dice que, en la fe, podemos aceptar nuestro propio sufrimiento y compartir el sufrimiento de los demás. De esta manera, el sufrimiento humano se une al amor redentor de Cristo y, por lo tanto, forma parte del poder divino que transforma el mundo para mejor.
