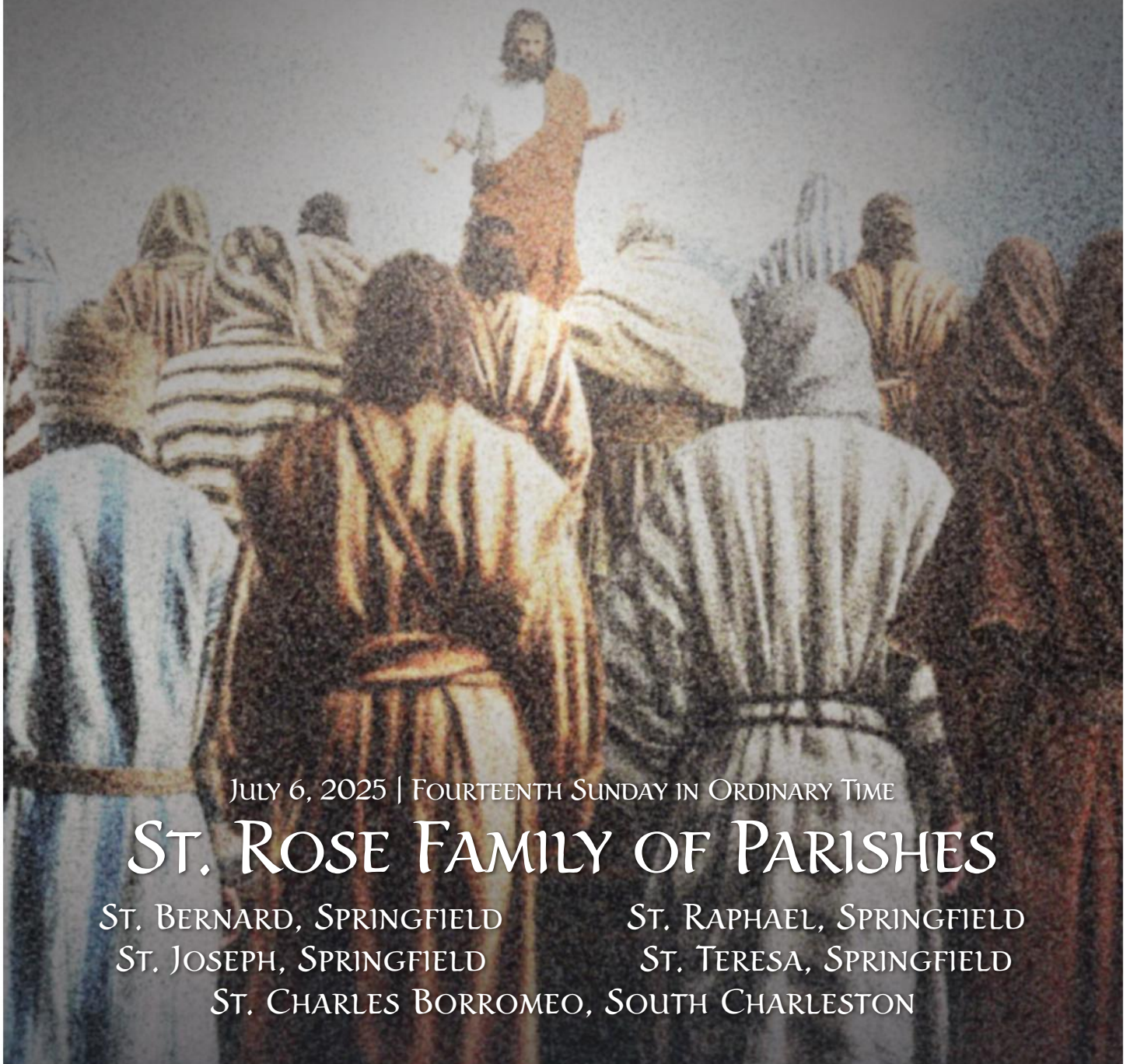

Pastor's Corner



From the Pastor, July 6, 2025

The two-part episode in the (long-form) of the Gospel for today is really fascinating (Luke 10:1-12, 17-20). Jesus sends out the 72 to do a certain limited job and gives them certain limited powers to do so. They come back and are elated about how it has gone. It is like they are surprised that the powers He gave to them were real. "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name." These are extraordinary powers, we would agree. But one person is not surprised: Jesus. He has seen far greater things than they have – "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky" – and He cares about things far greater than their ability to go and do a few things. He wants them to rejoice not in the powers they have, but in the relationship they have with Him.

It may come as a shock to us, but our lives here are not all about what we can do for God, but about what He can do for us. God doesn't need us to do anything for Him. He may ask us to step into a certain place, for sure, but He doesn't need anything from us. On the other hand, we are in desperate need of Him. We need Him to save us. We cannot save us through our own efforts – there were some people who held that belief in the Early Church called Pelagians and it was condemned as a heresy. We should try to work out our salvation, as St. Paul says, in "fear and trembling," desiring to "rejoice because our names are written in heaven."

El episodio en dos partes del Evangelio de hoy (la forma larga) es realmente fascinante (Lucas 10, 1-12.17-20). Jesús envía a los 72 discípulos a cumplir una tarea concreta y les da ciertos poderes limitados para hacerlo. Ellos regresan llenos de alegría por cómo les fue. Es como si se sorprendieran de que los poderes que Él les había dado fueran reales. "Señor, hasta los demonios se nos someten en tu nombre." Son poderes extraordinarios, estamos de acuerdo. Pero hay una persona que no se sorprende: Jesús. Él ha visto cosas mucho más grandes que ellos – "Yo veía a Satanás caer del cielo como un rayo" – y se preocupa por cosas mucho más importantes que su capacidad de hacer algunas cosas. Lo que Él desea es que se alegren no por los poderes que tienen, sino por la relación que tienen con Él.

Puede que nos sorprenda, pero nuestra vida aquí no se trata tanto de lo que nosotros podemos hacer por Dios, sino de lo que Él puede hacer por nosotros. Dios no necesita que hagamos nada por Él. Claro, puede pedirnos que entremos en un lugar o situación concreta, pero no necesita nada de nosotros. En cambio, nosotros sí lo necesitamos desesperadamente a Él. Necesitamos que Él nos salve. No podemos salvarnos a nosotros mismos con nuestro propio esfuerzo – en la Iglesia primitiva hubo personas que sostenían esa creencia, llamados pelagianos, y fue condenada como herejía. Debemos esforzarnos en trabajar por nuestra salvación, como dice San Pablo, con "temor y temblor," deseando "alegrarnos porque nuestros nombres están escritos en el cielo."

Forming Other Councils

Good people, I hope that you have not yet forgotten what Beacons of Light is – but, if you have, this is a reminder!! Beacons of Light is a process of pastoral planning to best arrange all the resources of the archdiocese to proclaim the Gospel and make disciples in this particular time and place. There are a couple other groups that are either necessary or good to have in this process. The first, a necessary group, is the Family Finance Council. The second, not necessary but very helpful to get everyone on the same page, is the Family Liturgical Committee.

Let's talk about the Family Finance Council first. It is required by canon law for each parish to have a finance council. The way that I have arranged for the Family Finance Council to work with this requirement is to have all individual finance councils meet at the same time, in the same place, and talk about the same things – this means that I get more eyes on the matter and this has been helpful! An area of needed further development will be to gather together a more stable membership and concretize the purpose and goals of the group.

Next, let's talk about the Family Liturgical Committee. As I previously stated, Fr. Elijah had been put in the position of Director of Worship, now replaced by Fr. Robert Hale – this is because they were/are well-suited for this role, because of their skills and leadership ability. The purpose of this group is to bring unity among liturgical practice in our various locations and bring about a greater following of the liturgical principles of the Second Vatican Council and especially the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM). It also discusses other liturgical matters that can come up, such as scheduling or other adjacent ministries.

Formación de Otros Consejos

Querido pueblo de Dios, ¡espero que no se hayan olvidado todavía de qué se trata Beacons of Light! Pero, si lo han hecho, ¡esto es un recordatorio! Beacons of Light es un proceso de planificación pastoral que busca organizar de la mejor manera posible todos los recursos de la arquidiócesis para proclamar el Evangelio y formar discípulos en este tiempo y lugar concretos. Hay un par de grupos adicionales que son necesarios o muy útiles dentro de este proceso. El primero, un grupo necesario, es el Consejo de Finanzas de la Familia Parroquial. El segundo, no obligatorio pero muy útil para la unidad, es el Comité Litúrgico de la Familia Parroquial.

Comencemos con el Consejo de Finanzas de la Familia Parroquial. El derecho canónico exige que cada parroquia tenga su propio consejo de finanzas. La manera en que he organizado este consejo, respetando ese requisito, es haciendo que todos los consejos financieros individuales se reúnan al mismo tiempo, en el mismo lugar, y hablen de los mismos temas. Esto me permite tener más ojos atentos sobre los asuntos y ¡ha sido muy útil! Un área que aún necesita desarrollarse es formar una membresía más estable y concretar el propósito y los objetivos del grupo.

Ahora hablemos del Comité Litúrgico de la Familia Parroquial. Como mencioné anteriormente, el P. Elijah fue nombrado Director de Liturgia, y ahora ha sido reemplazado por el P. Robert Hale – ambos han sido apropiadamente elegidos por sus habilidades y capacidad de liderazgo. El propósito de este grupo es promover la unidad en la práctica litúrgica entre nuestras distintas comunidades y asegurar una mayor fidelidad a los principios litúrgicos del Concilio Vaticano II, especialmente a la Instrucción General del Misal Romano (IGMR). También se abordan otros temas litúrgicos que puedan surgir, como los horarios o ministerios relacionados.

Saint Benedict

Saint of the Day: July 11

Patron Saint of Kidney Disease and Poisoning

It is unfortunate that no contemporary biography was written of a man who has exercised the greatest influence on monasticism in the West. Benedict is well recognized in the later Dialogues of Saint Gregory, but these are sketches to illustrate miraculous elements of his career.

Benedict was born into a distinguished family in central Italy, studied at Rome, and early in life was drawn to monasticism. At first he became a hermit, leaving a depressing world – pagan armies on the march, the Church torn by schism, people suffering from war, morality at a low ebb.

He soon realized that he could not live a hidden life in a small town any better than in a large city, so he withdrew to a cave high in the mountains for three years. Some monks chose Benedict as their leader for a while, but found his strictness not to their taste. Still the shift from hermit to community life had begun for him. He had an idea of gathering various families of monks into one "Grand Monastery" to give them the benefit of unity, fraternity, and permanent worship in one house. Finally he began to build what was to become one of the most famous monasteries in the world – Monte Cassino, commanding three narrow valleys running toward the mountains north of Naples.

The Rule that gradually developed prescribed a life of liturgical prayer, study, manual labor, and living together in community under a common abbot. Benedictine asceticism is known for its moderation, and Benedictine charity has always shown concern for the people in the surrounding countryside. In the course of the Middle Ages, all monasticism in the West was gradually brought under the Rule of St. Benedict.

Today the Benedictine family is represented by two branches: the Benedictine Federation encompassing the men and women of the Order of St. Benedict; and the Cistercians, men and women of the Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance.
