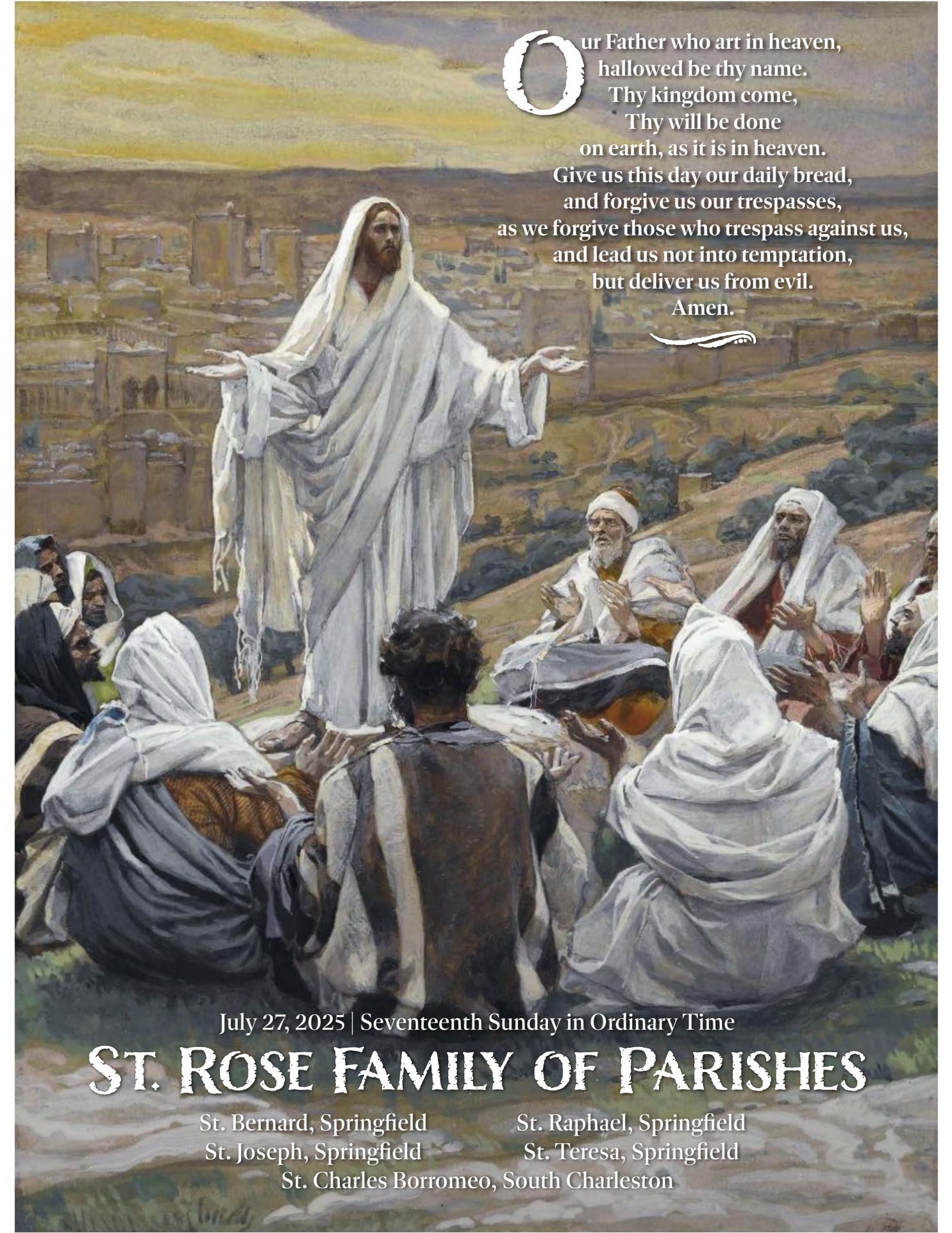

Pastor's Corner



From the Pastor, July 27, 2025

The theme for the readings for this Sunday is persistence. Abraham, in the first reading, is persistent in his petition to spare certain towns because of the good people present in them. Jesus, in the Gospel, tells a parable about a persistent friend, persistent to the point of annoyance. So, the lesson, I think, is that we should be persistent. The question that I want to ask is: Persistent about what?

I think we can break it down into two categories. One is mentioned in the first half of the Our Father – “Thy kingdom come.” We ask to be good subjects of the King of the Universe. And we need help to do that – which is why Jesus says we should ask our good Father for the Holy Spirit and He is so happy to give us this great Gift. The second is mentioned in the second half of the Our Father – “forgive us our sins.” We need to be persistent in asking for forgiveness for our sins. You have probably wondered why I am constantly preaching that Confession should be a regular part of our Christian life. I was hoping that my persistence will draw each one of you to be persistent in asking forgiveness for your sins from our merciful God. We commit sin, it does no good to deny it. As St. John says in his first letter (1:10): “If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.” So, to sum up – we should be persistent in asking for the gift of forgiveness and the gift of divine life.

El tema de las lecturas de este domingo es la persistencia. Abraham, en la primera lectura, es persistente en su súplica para que ciertas ciudades sean perdonadas por el bien de las personas justas que viven en ellas. Jesús, en el Evangelio, cuenta una parábola sobre un amigo persistente — persistente hasta el punto de ser molesto. Entonces, la lección, creo yo, es que debemos ser persistentes. Pero la pregunta que quiero hacer es: ¿persistentes en qué?

Creo que podemos dividirlo en dos categorías. La primera se menciona en la primera parte del Padre Nuestro: “Venga tu Reino.” Pedimos ser buenos súbditos del Rey del Universo. Y necesitamos ayuda para lograrlo — por eso Jesús dice que debemos pedirle al buen Padre el Espíritu Santo, y Él se alegra tanto en darnos ese gran Don. La segunda se menciona en la segunda parte del Padre Nuestro: “Perdona nuestras ofensas.” Debemos ser persistentes en pedir perdón por nuestros pecados. Probablemente se hayan preguntado por qué predicó tan frecuentemente sobre la importancia de la Confesión como parte regular de nuestra vida cristiana. Es porque espero que mi persistencia inspire en cada uno de ustedes una persistencia en pedir perdón a nuestro Dios misericordioso. Cometemos pecado — no sirve de nada negarlo. Como dice San Juan en su primera carta (1,10): “Si decimos que no hemos pecado, lo hacemos pasar por mentiroso, y su palabra no está en nosotros.” Así que, en resumen: debemos ser persistentes en pedir el don del perdón y el don de la vida divina.

Low Attendance at Weekend Masses

I am sure that you have noticed that, over the years, there has been a decline in Mass attendance in our Family of Parishes. Just look around. Even in the few years since my pastoral internship here in Springfield (2017-2018) under the mentorship of Fr. John MacQuarrie, I have seen a significant decline in Mass attendance. And we have the numbers to back that up – we have data going back to the late 1990s on Mass attendance. I have included in this bulletin a graph of the decline – see the steep downward slope since 2010. These numbers show a significant decline.

Now is not the time to discuss how that has come about – that’s a different conversation for a different day. What is necessary now is for us to look at our Mass schedule and ask, “What is needed for our Family of Parishes?” It doesn’t make sense to maintain the same schedule as before – especially since we have much fewer people. If we do that, then we will have what we have now: small crowds at Mass with many Masses. These are not vibrant Masses – and a vibrant experience of the Catholic Church is what I hope we desire on Sunday. So the first reason why we are looking into modifying the weekend Mass schedule is that our Mass schedule is not the right size for the number of people going to Mass.

Las Antorchas están Encendidas

Baja Asistencia a las Misas del Fin de Semana

Estoy seguro de que se han dado cuenta de que, a lo largo de los años, ha habido una disminución en la asistencia a Misa dentro de nuestra Familia de Parroquias. Solo basta con mirar alrededor. Incluso en los pocos años que han pasado desde mi pasantía pastoral aquí en Springfield (2017-2018), bajo la mentoría del P. John MacQuarrie, he notado una disminución significativa en la asistencia. Y tenemos los datos que respaldan esa percepción – contamos con registros de asistencia a Misa desde finales de los años 90. He incluido en este boletín un gráfico que muestra esta tendencia – fíjense en la fuerte caída desde el año 2010. Los números indican una baja considerable.

Este no es el momento para analizar cómo llegamos a esta situación – esa es una conversación para otro día. Lo que sí es necesario ahora es mirar nuestro horario de Misas y preguntarnos: “¿Qué necesita realmente nuestra Familia de Parroquias?” No tiene sentido mantener el mismo horario de siempre, especialmente cuando tenemos muchas menos personas. Si lo hacemos, terminamos con lo que vemos ahora: pequeñas congregaciones repartidas en muchas Misas. Estas no son celebraciones vibrantes – y una experiencia viva y vibrante de la Iglesia Católica es lo que espero que todos deseemos para nuestros domingos.

Por eso, la primera razón por la que estamos considerando modificar el horario de las Misas del fin de semana es esta: nuestro horario actual no corresponde al número real de personas que asisten a Misa.

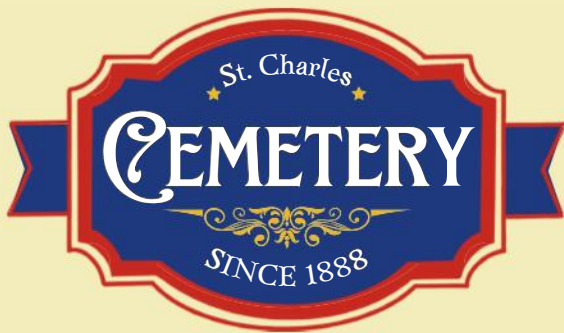

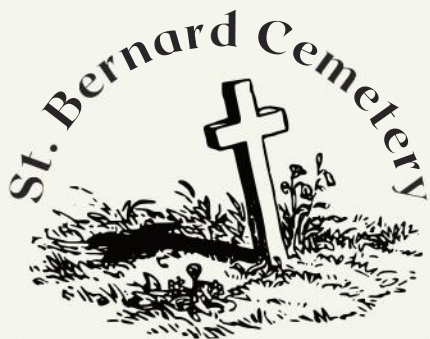

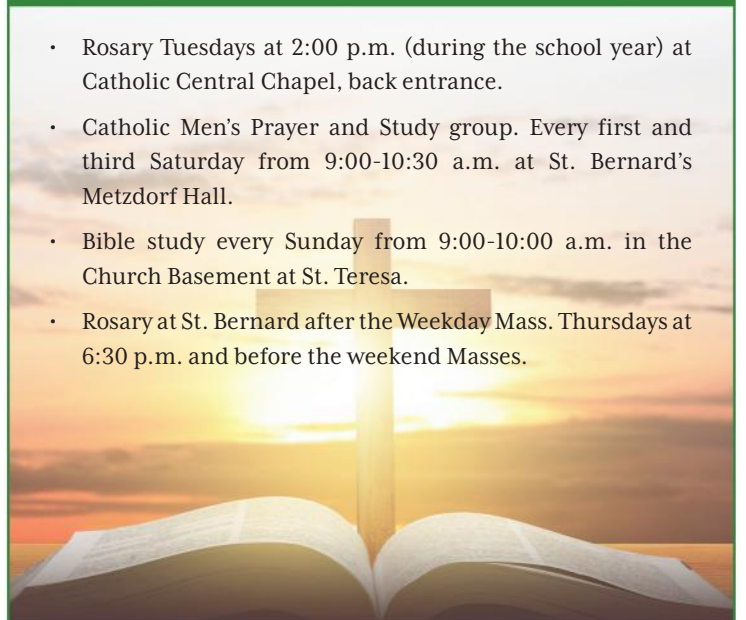
