Pastor's Corner



From the Pastor,
September 28, 2025

The story of the rich man and Lazarus that we hear in the Gospel (Luke 16:19-31) can be a story which we have heard before and with which we are familiar – and yet, since the Scripture is so rich, perhaps we have not received some of the lessons from it.

One of the lessons is the existence of hell. Recently, a priest wrote a book called, “The Hell There Is: An Exploration of an Often-Rejected Doctrine of the Church,” which my mom read and enjoyed reading. We must remember that Jesus was clear about teaching not only the existence of hell, but also how hell plays a central role in God’s plan for salvation. Hell is not a construct where God sends bad people. Hell is the place which people choose with their freewill. Hell exists because God is merciful and wants to extend His mercy to all – but will not force anyone.

And so we are presented today with an invitation to receive not only the “law and the prophets” (which to us can mean Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition, guided by the Magisterium), but also the “one who has come back from the dead” (which is only Jesus Himself). We are asked to use our freewill to choose the way of God and conform our lives to His way.

La historia del hombre rico y Lázaro que escuchamos en el Evangelio (Lucas 16, 19-31) puede ser un relato que ya hemos oído antes y con el cual estamos familiarizados. Y, sin embargo, como la Sagrada Escritura es tan rica, quizá no hayamos recibido todavía todas las lecciones que contiene.

Una de esas lecciones es la existencia del infierno. Recientemente, un sacerdote escribió un libro titulado “El infierno que existe: Una exploración de una doctrina de la Iglesia a menudo rechazada,” que mi madre leyó y disfrutó mucho. Debemos recordar que Jesús fue claro al enseñar no solo la existencia del infierno, sino también cómo el infierno juega un papel central en el plan de salvación de Dios. El infierno no es un invento donde Dios envía a la gente mala. El infierno es el lugar que las personas eligen con su libre albedrío. El infierno existe porque Dios es misericordioso y quiere extender su misericordia a todos, pero no obligará a nadie.

Y así se nos presenta hoy una invitación a acoger no solo “la ley y los profetas” (que para nosotros significa la Sagrada Escritura y la Sagrada Tradición, guiadas por el Magisterio), sino también a “Aquel que ha resucitado de entre los muertos” (que no es otro sino Jesús mismo). Se nos pide usar nuestra libertad para elegir el camino de Dios y conformar nuestra vida a su camino.

There will be losses to grieve – things will not be as they were. We have fewer priests, so we have to have fewer Masses. Someone recently brought up to me that there were 5 priests at St. Raphael at one time! It is not like that anymore. But there is a hopeful future that is prepared for us – let's work toward that future together!

Mission Cooperative Appeal: *Diocese of Kumbakonam, India*

Our parish has been chosen this year to participate in the Mission Cooperative Appeal with the Diocese of Kumbakonam, India. Bishop Jeevanandam Amalanathan and Rev. Antony Muthu will visit our parish this weekend, September 27/28, to share more about their work.

Founded in 1899, the Diocese of Kumbakonam is located in Tamil Nadu, India. It serves a Catholic population of more than 213,000 faithful (about 6% of the population) spread across 94 parishes and 610 mission stations. The diocese is blessed with many vocations – served by 224 diocesan and 79 religious priests, 620 nuns, 12 trained catechists, 330 lay catechists, and two social service centers.

Missionary Needs

The diocese faces many pressing challenges as it seeks to evangelize and serve its people, especially the poor and marginalized. Key priorities include:

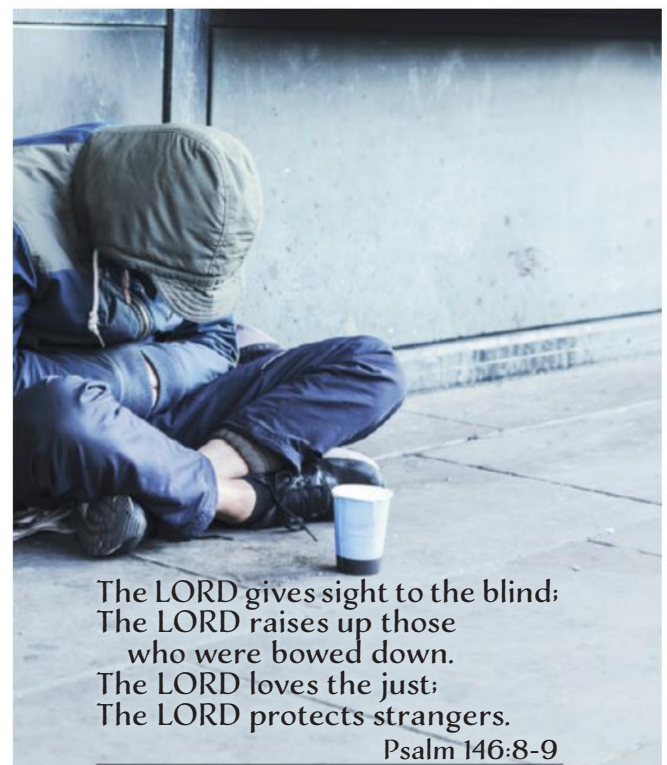
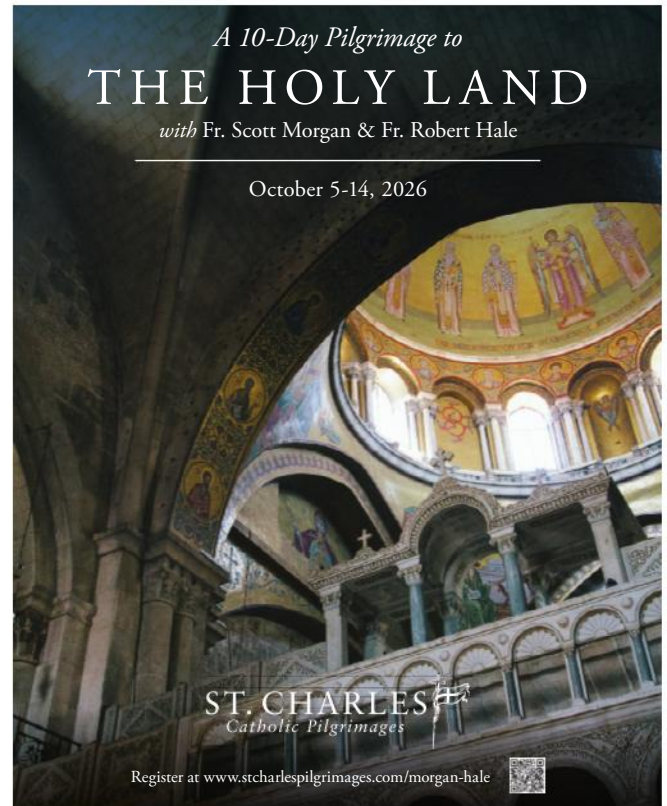
- Establishing 8 new parishes, each with a church and rectory, to better serve large mission areas.
- Supporting 136 Catholic schools and 22 orphanages with better facilities, resources, and catechetical materials.
- Training and equipping 480 nuns and nearly 5,000 Catholic teachers who provide catechesis, education, and healthcare.
- Expanding the Church's medical outreach, including hospitals for lepers, clinics, and homes for children affected by HIV.
- Supporting the education of seminarians, as the diocese has abundant vocations to priesthood and religious life.
- Providing food, shelter, and education for thousands of very poor or orphaned children, many from single-parent households or vulnerable situations.

How You Can Help

Your generosity makes a real difference. The following examples show what your gift can provide:

The Choirs of the St. Rose Family of Parishes are now resuming their ministry of music.

The **Adult Choir of St. Bernard** rehearses on Thursdays at 7:00 p.m. in St. Bernard Church. The Choir's first rehearsal was Thursday, September 25, and will begin singing for the Sunday 8:30 a.m. Mass on October 5. The **St. Bernard Guitar Group** sings on the last Saturday of the month at the 4:30 p.m. Mass, rehearsing 45 minutes before Mass. The **St. Bernard Youth / Young Adult Choir** sings on the first Saturday of the month at the 4:30 p.m. Mass, rehearsing on the 3rd and 4th Thursdays of the month from 3:30-4:30 p.m. The **Funeral Choir** joins to sing for scheduled funerals as members are able, with no advance rehearsal.

The **Choir of St. Joseph** rehearses on Tuesdays from 6:00-7:30 p.m. in the choir loft at St. Joseph Church. The choir resumed rehearsals on September 9, and sings for the Sunday 8:00 a.m. Mass, with a brief warm-up 10 to 15 minutes before Mass.

The **Choir of St. Raphael** rehearses on Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m. in the choir loft at St. Raphael Church. The choir's first rehearsal was Wednesday, September 24, and will begin singing for the Sunday 10:30 a.m. Mass on September 28. The Choir gathers to warm-up/rehearse on Sunday mornings at 9:45 a.m.

The **Choir of St. Teresa** resumed singing for the Sunday 11:00 a.m. Mass on September 7. The choir rehearses on Sunday mornings from 9:40-10:40 a.m., before Mass.

The Choir Season generally runs through Pentecost (May 26, 2026), and possibly through the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (June 7, 2026). The style of music used in our liturgies ranges from traditional and classical to contemporary. This is a commitment on the part of choir members that is greatly appreciated.
