Pastor's Corner

From the Pastor, January 18, 2026

I am not a fan of Ordinary Time – I think it was a bad idea, a silly idea. You may think I am crazy, but perhaps you don't know the history. Ordinary Time (in Latin called “tempus per annum” – “time of the year” or “time through the year”) was invented in the 20th century by the misplaced creativity of some liturgists. And these liturgists wanted to call it ordinary because it is “ordered” time – which is all well and good, I like order a lot. My problem is with how they ordered it. The change implies that there was no order before – which is totally wrong. There was order before, it was ordered differently. It was ordered around two great feast days of the calendar – Epiphany and Pentecost. Therefore, the Sundays after Epiphany were called 1st Sunday after Epiphany, 2nd Sunday after Epiphany, and so on, and the same for the Sundays after Pentecost.

I think that we unnecessarily jettisoned a beautiful part of our tradition by moving to “tempus per annum.” Our time throughout the year should constantly point to the mysteries of our faith, of the revelation which has been given to us. It should constantly point to the Lamb of God, which St. John the Baptist is constantly doing, as we see in the Gospel today from the beginning of St. John's Gospel. May we orient our whole lives, including our organization of time, around the mysteries revealed to us.

Del Pastor, 18 de Enero de 2026

No soy fan del Tiempo Ordinario; creo que fue una mala idea, una tontería. Quizás pienses que estoy loco, pero quizás no conozcas su historia. El Tiempo Ordinario (en latín, “tempus per annum” - “tiempo del año” o “tiempo a través del año”) fue inventado en el siglo XX por la creatividad descontrolada de algunos liturgistas. Y estos liturgistas querían llamarlo ordinario porque es tiempo “ordenado”, lo cual está muy bien, me gusta mucho el orden. Mi problema es cómo lo ordenaron. El cambio implica que antes no había orden, lo cual es totalmente erróneo. Había orden antes, pero se ordenaba de forma diferente. Se organizaba en torno a dos grandes festividades del calendario: Epifanía y Pentecostés. Por lo tanto, los domingos posteriores a Epifanía se llamaban 1.er domingo después de Epifanía, 2.º domingo después de Epifanía, y así sucesivamente, y lo mismo para los domingos posteriores a Pentecostés.

Creo que desechamos innecesariamente una parte hermosa de nuestra tradición al adoptar el “tempus per annum”. Nuestro tiempo a lo largo del año debería apuntar constantemente a los misterios de nuestra fe, a la revelación que nos ha sido dada. Debería apuntar constantemente al Cordero de Dios, como lo hace constantemente San Juan Bautista, como vemos en el Evangelio de hoy desde el comienzo del Evangelio de San Juan. Orientemos toda nuestra vida, incluyendo nuestra organización del tiempo, en torno a los misterios que nos han sido revelados.

Important: Anointing of the Sick

One of the things that is regularly asked of our priests is for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. This is a Sacrament established by Jesus for the consolation of those “who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age” (Canon Law 1004). The effects of the Sacrament are beautiful – it gives comfort in suffering and courage to overcome the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. It can lead to physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and assists in preparing for passing into eternal life.

Because of the greatness of this Sacrament, our desire to serve our people well, and the frenetic pace of serving five parishes at one time, Fr. Komo and Fr. Hale have decided to only receive requests for the Anointing of the Sick through an online form. This is to assist us in serving you better for many reasons. It, first, ensures that our priests are contacted in a timely manner. Once the form is completed, a notification is sent immediately to our priests. Second, it provides us with the information we need to serve our people well. Third, it removes confusion about how to contact a priest, which has been a significant barrier in the past.

We should remember that we should not wait until the point of death to call for a priest. As it says in our Catechism #1512: “It is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived.” It is important that we are accompanied through the “ordinary means of sanctification” which Jesus has given us, especially this wonderful Sacrament of healing!
