How to Host a Lighting Walk

Set Objectives and Date

Define the purpose of the event: to identify areas where lighting is insufficient for safety. Choose a time after dark when visibility concerns are most apparent.

Prepare Safety Materials

Provide flashlights, reflective vests, clipboards, and maps of the neighborhood. Safety should be emphasized, especially when walking near roads.

Organize Participants into Teams

Divide the neighborhood into manageable routes to ensure thorough coverage. Assign a team leader for each group to guide documentation.

Conduct the Walk

Walk slowly through designated areas, noting poorly lit streets, alleys, and gathering spots. Record addresses and, when possible, take photographs to support findings.

Report and Follow Up

Compile all findings into a single report. Submit to the appropriate city department or utility provider. Share updates with the community and track progress to ensure improvements are implemented.
