



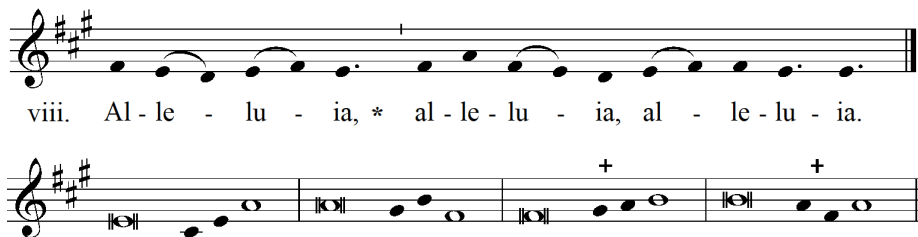
2. Psalmody - three Psalms and a NT Canticle with Antiphons

to be pondered by all who love them.

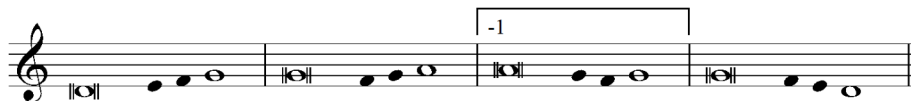
Majestic and glorious his work,

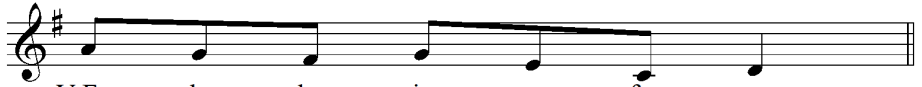
