02 • Ready

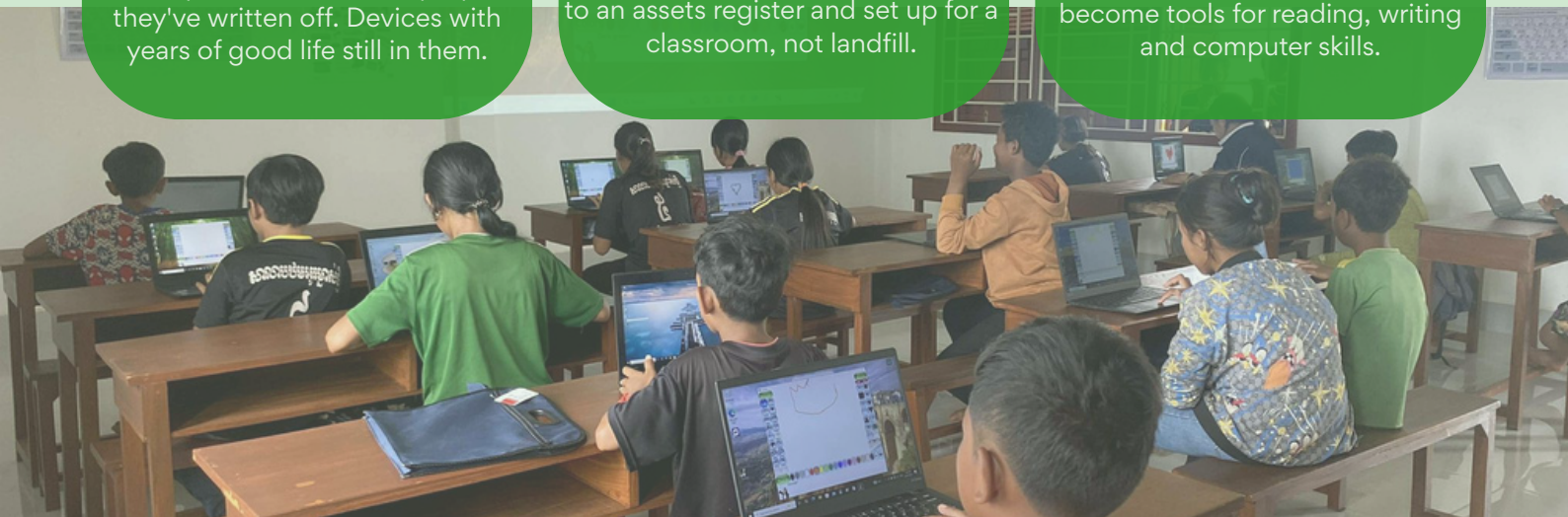
Wiped and prepared
