Need A Ride To

Can someone shout "REVIVAL!"? That's exactly what took place at C.A.G.E Holy Convocation 2025. The theme was "Revival & Reform Phase 2: Lord, send the FIRE!;" it gets no better than that. Our sister Alicia Robinson said the "Convocation was just perfect. From the first night, it was nothing but power; this was the best year yet." This was not just a few days of church services...this was a special appointment with God.

On Thursday, September 18th, we kicked off the first night of convocation. We received a word from the Lord, by way of Apostle Levern McKenny of Prayer Mountain Ministries entitled "The Integrity of God's Word." He came from Numbers 23: 1-19, and expounded on how important it is to be anchored in the holy word. The nineteenth verse states, "God is not a man that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent..." This alone is encouragement to the people of God that everything He speaks and has spoken is not vain words fallen to the ground. Apostle McKenny allowed God to use him to minister when we walk in our belief system, God's holy word, nothing or nobody can succeed against us. It's imperative that we do not lose confidence in what the Lord says, according to Hebrews 10:35. As Bishop Michael Cook says, "Don't let the devil talk you out of what God has talked you into!"

Moving into Friday's service, the saints moved from faith to faith, and glory to glory. Apostle Jeremiah Merritt delivered a potent message out of Matthew 25:1-12, speaking on the oil, the five wise and five foolish virgins. The sermon bears the title "The Oil is our Entry Fee." Apostle Merritt utilizes this particular passage of scripture to admonish the people of God, that it's time to stock up on their own oil, which is the anointing. Living in the present day climate, believers of Christ can not afford to not store up, and rely upon the Anointed One. Wouldn't you get an oil change before you take a 12-hour road trip? We are unable to destroy yokes and relieve others of burdens, without the anointing of the Lord. By way of the Holy Ghost, the man of God challenged the saints and commanded us to retrieve our oil. WE ARE WITHOUT AN EXCUSE!

After such a mighty move of God on Friday night, expectations were high for the Saturday sessions. First, we started the day with a delicious continental breakfast. Then, we went into service with praise and worship. Next, we brought on Pastor Dean Page, to bring forth the word for the first session. Pastor Page taught on the topic "The Art of Not Knowing;" coming from Mark 8: 22-26. He expounded how we can be

in trouble when we think we know everything. We, in a sense, start to play god in our lives. According to the word of God, the Lord admonishes us to trust Him with all our heart and to not lean on our own intellect; and in result, he will direct our path (Proverbs 3:5-6). It is just like the time God led Ezekiel to the valley of dry bones, and He asked Ezekiel if the bones could live; Ezekiel answered and said "O Lord God, thou knowest" (Ezekiel 37). Moments like these are the best opportunities for the Lord to express how much he's the all-knowing God he says he is. After that, we had a break and then we received Chief Apostle Carlton Sydnor for our second breakout session. Apostle Sydnor came from Judges 7: 1-8, and posed the question "Did I Make the Cut?" as the topic. This word was for self-evaluation of our heart, mind, and spirit. According to this base scripture, Gideon is preparing to go to war but God was prohibiting him to go due to the amount of soldiers he had. He had to strip Gideon of the excess men he had, because that's what Gideon thought would cause him to triumph. Sometimes you have to wait and be disciplined before you can accomplish what God has assigned for you to do. Following our sessions, we spent the rest of the Saturday fellowshipping, playing indoor and outdoor games, eating food and more praise.

Finally, to close our exhilarating weekend of convocation, we dressed in our Sunday's best and had some good ol' High Church. Before the word came forth, we were graced with an uplifting song from one of the baddest choirs, apart from C.A.G.E: King of Kings Mass Choir. After that, C.A.G.E's very own Pastor Rick Jackson; Victory Faith Outreach, preached a sermon entitled "Stay Connected to the Fire." He came from scriptures Jeremiah 20:9, Jeremiah 23:28, and Matthew 10: 34-39. After God sent the fire from the first service to the last, Pastor Jackson encouraged the people of God to stay connected to it. The fire of God takes on many different functions such as: source of light, it purifies, and symbolizes the Lord's presence. Now that God provided, it's up to us to pay the price to keep it.

Tent Crusade







On May 4th, 2025, New Grace Temple began its powerful 6-day tent revival. Elder Tony Jones brought forth the word titled "Calling: Whose call will you answer?". Coming from Romans 12:1-2 he recommended that the people answer the call to sanctification. According to the Oxford dictionary, call is defined as an appeal or demand. Answering the call to sanctification is detrimental to the life of any believer who is going to be effective in the kingdom. Night 2 of the tent revival opened with anticipation as Elder Quintin Jones stressed the importance of continual encounters with the Holy Spirit. Ministering from Mark 10:46-50, he urged the people to come out of their comfort zones, warning them that staying comfortable leads to spiritual stagnation. We as the body of Christ should always be seeking for more of him. Matthew 5:6 gives us a clear prerequisite to having an encounter with the Holy Spirit as it says they that hunger and thirst after righteousness shall be filled. We know that in the natural hunger and thirst lead to malnourishment and dehydration but in the spirit, it leads to an infilling of the Holy Ghost.

After experiencing a night full of encounters Bishop Michael Cook ministered from the text Genesis 4:1-4 with the subject matter, "The process of time." He expounded on God's intent to bring about change in our lives through opposition and spiritual warfare. To bear the fruit of longsuffering you must first suffer, for it is often God's instrument for change. He encouraged us not to give into frustration, because it breeds rebellion which aborts the plan of God. On night four Elder T. Jones came back to encourage us to bounce back. He admonished the people to beware

of those Delilah's in our lives and how important it is to break constant cycles. As the revival continued, night five challenged the people to evaluate their decision makings. Elder Timothy Quillens ministered from Leviticus 10:1-2 with the message:

"Do the right thing." He emphasized the importance of humbling ourselves before God, out of genuine need for change. These nights placed a demand on our hearts being postured for true revival through endurance and the putting away of evil.

Night six, Elder Q. Jones ministered to the people on "Living a life of praise." Living a life of praise starts with the inward man rather than the outward. The speaker reminded everyone that praise does not stop at the altar, but it continues in our everyday life. As the week ended, it was clear that revival is not just a few nights of preaching, but a consistent choice to walk with the Lord daily.
