What is Pride?

The Lust of the Flesh, The Lust of the Eyes, and the Pride of Life

Who is God, but the creator of all things? What He made, He made it good the first time and it was without flaw. The relationships and interaction amongst humanity, namely, between men and women is something that He ordained with intention and purpose. Yet, it has become a breeding ground for corruption, perversion, and idolatry.

As the first married couple in history, Adam and Eve served as the blueprint for what marriage should look like. "The Wayward Man"

Wayward... for how much longer?

The wayward man, as we were taught by Elder Jones during Sunday Morning Bible school, is a dangerous man, not only to him/herself but also to others. He is defined as one who is difficult to control or predict, because of unusual or perverse behavior. He or she is known to be self-willed, headstrong, rebellious and defiant, to name a few. You could assume that he is oppressed or even possessed by the spirit of the devil and you would be right!

In the series on this reluctant, Wayward man, we were given some hard evidence on the sin nature, that is carried out by this ungovernable individual. It is already noted that sin separates us from God, but let's look at it further. It is the appeasement of the fleshly desires of man and also, the luring of one into a deceptive nature by hiding its real intent. That sounds just like a device of Satan. James 1:15 tells us "Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death. To simplify it, The wayward man is being lured to his own death! This should be enough to turn this man's heart back to God, but remember, he's defiant and probably hasn't let the Spirit of the Lord fully into his heart. He is deceived to think what he is doing is his own free will to do; and do whatever he pleases. Sounds like Pride because it is!

Let's talk about lust (sins mother). Lust is a desire for something that is forbidden. And since we know that lust was able to conceive, it must have been intimate with whatever was forbidden at a given time. I'll be more specific.... Hence the name, Sodom and Gomorrah zoomed past their chance with God, Saul had a chance, Solomon had a chance and Cain had a chance. But the fact that they did do evil in the sight of God, simply means that they allowed lust to conceive sin which brought forth their destruction. So what does this all mean for us today? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? God forbid!(Romans 6:2)

Here are key points that broaden the scope of the tactics used by the devil to destroy God's people. They are as follows: "Sin will take you where you never intended to go, keep you longer than you intended to stay and cost you more than you intended to pay." So, how much longer will you allow lust to conceive sin in your life, instead of living by faith as depicted in Hebrews 11:24-25, where Moses refused to be known as the son of Pharaoh's daughter and chose to be mistreated with the people of God instead of indulging in the pleasures of sin. He was obedient and did not act upon lust, which could have compromised his position in God's plan for delivering God's people. He Submitted himself to God, resisted the devil and the devil fled from him (see James 4:7). This could only be prevalent in our lives if we allow the Holy Spirit to take the lead and not fulfill the lust of the flesh. It's a faith walk; and I've decided to live by faith!

Romans 12:1 states, "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service."
