#### Christmas 2022

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

What did Mary and Joseph have that first Christmas? By some measures, not much. Far from home, they were without a place to stay. Distant from relatives, they had no one to welcome them. Alone against Herod's soldiers, they fled to Egypt.

What Mary and Joseph had plenty of was hardship, uncertainty, and humility. They faced a ninety mile journey from Nazareth, no room at the inn and a cold cave with ox and ass. Yes, by some measures Mary and Joseph did not have much. However, by another, truer measure, Mary and Joseph had everything. They had everything they needed to fill their hearts with love, their spirits with courage and their minds with peace. They had Jesus. That was the essence of Christmas for Mary and Joseph.
