Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

Provides financial assistance to eligible households to help pay the cost of the home energy bills and other energy-related services.

LIHEAP services are typically provided through local community action agencies in each region. To apply for LIHEAP, individuals must submit a pre-application through the [Mississippi Common Web Portal](#).

Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP)

This program helps income-eligible residents maintain access to drinking water and wastewater services. It provides financial assistance to help cover costs related to water and sewer bills, reconnection fees, late fees, and water-related lien removal fees. Applications can be completed at [Mississippi Common Web Portal](#).

Mississippi Access to Maternal Assistance (MAMA)

A website and mobile app to connect pregnant women and new mothers with resources available in Mississippi. The law requires the inclusion of resources, services, and information through private organizations and public agencies. For more information, visit <https://www.mama.ms.gov/>.

Medicaid

Helps pay for medical services for low income people. To be eligible, you must be a MS resident, in need of healthcare insurance, low-income, and also: pregnant, or be responsible for a child 18 years or younger, or blind, or have a disability, or be 65 years of age or older. Skill UP Mississippi

Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)

This program provides supplemental foods, nutrition education, and health care referrals to low-income pregnant, breastfeeding, and postpartum women, as well as infants and children up to age 5 who are at nutritional risk. Eligibility is determined by a health professional. For information on scheduling an appointment to apply [Contact Us - Mississippi State Department of Health](#).

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

Provides benefits to eligible low-income individuals and families via an Electronic Benefits Transfer card. This card can be used like a debit card to purchase eligible food in authorized retail food stores. Applications can be completed at [Mississippi Common Web Portal](#).

Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)

This program provides monthly payments to children and their caretaker relatives who have limited income or resources to meet basic needs. To qualify, applicants must have a child age 18 or younger or be pregnant and meet income eligibility requirements. For applications visit: [Mississippi Common Web Portal](#)

Unemployment Insurance

This program provides temporary financial assistance to workers in Mississippi who are unemployed through no fault of their own. To qualify, applicants must have worked in the state for the past 12 months (or longer in some cases), earned a minimum amount as defined by state guidelines, and actively seek work each week while receiving benefits. To apply, visit www.mdes.ms.gov/unemployment-claims/.
