From your Minister, April 2026

I'm aware that there's a degree of privilege inherent in this month's theme – *embracing possibility*. Not everyone has the same equitable access to possibility. Fewer and fewer options seem available to folks as they age. Or, if a person has any number of physical or mental disabilities, possibilities seem significantly reduced. And, it doesn't hurt to dream. I invite you to try the below spiritual practice this month to explore your inner yearnings and what they might mean. Even if you're never able to achieve your dream(s), what does entertaining said dream(s) mean?

Spiritual and religious traditions encourage and help us love the life we have. But it is fun - and often instructive - to imagine the life we would live if anything was possible.

So, to practice embracing possibility, lean into your imagination and write a poem or journal-sized reflection on what you would be if another life was possible. Be as silly or serious, playful or profound as you like. And remember, sometimes it helps to revisit what you dreamed about becoming when you were a child.

So what will it be? A trapeze artist? An impressionist painter? A member of King Aurther's court? A costume designer for movies set in the Victorian era? The owner of your own restaurant? The first person to walk on Mars? A death doula? A hermit? A circus clown? An urban planner of the first zero emission city? Spiderman?

Whether you take the playful or profound route, be sure to dedicate part of your writing to reflecting on the longing that lies at the center of your choice. This is where the deeper work lies. Because while you may not really be able to be a trapeze artist, it may be possible to satisfy that longing to escape the "gravity" of worry that sits at the center of that high-flying choice. Or to put it another way, you do not need to become that imagined version of yourself to access what it represents.

Faith Formation: Embracing Possibility

When I think about the possibilities for our church and our faith tradition, I get plum giddy! The values and principles we share make me realize that real change is not just possible—it's probable.

Possibilities are endless when built on a firm foundation. While we may not get "there" in my lifetime, I am convinced that the creation of a **Beloved Community** is at hand. This month, we invite our children and youth to explore what is possible when we work, play, and grow together.

Sunday Faith Formation Schedule

- **April 5th:** Children will be in the service the entire time. There will be no traditional classes; instead, we will transition directly into our **Easter Hunt and Potluck!**
- **April 12th:** We dive deeper into "Embracing Possibility" with a full hour of class for ages Preschool through High School.
- **April 19th & 26th:** Children will join the service for the first half hour and spend the final 30 minutes continuing our classroom conversations.

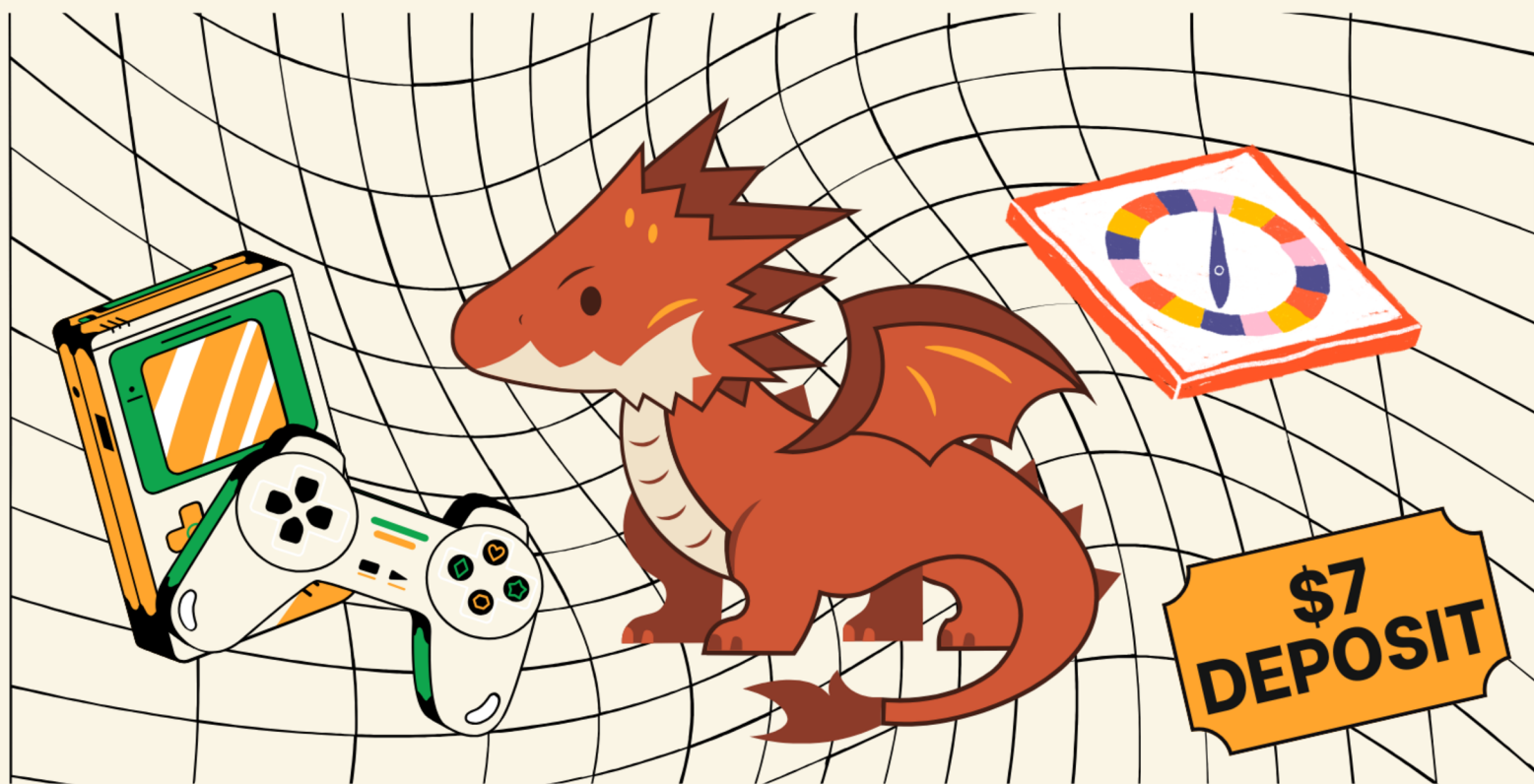

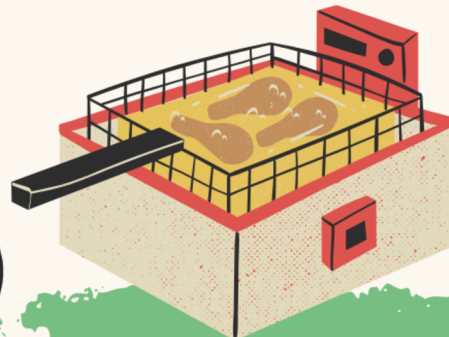

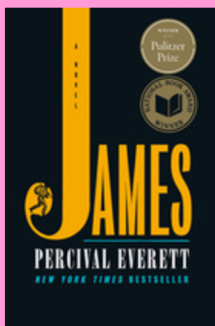
