From your Minister, January 2026

Happy New Year to everyone (at least according to the Julian calendar)! We have surpassed yet another arbitrary moment in our Earthly relationship with the sun. No matter how hard we might try, the Earth keeps on spinning. Try to resist. It won't work. Some things are gonna go, go, go and we have zero control.

Other things, less celestial things, of course, we can impact. This month, we will play with the idea of resistance. When to do it. When not to do it. In fact, our monthly theme is practicing resistance. When to do it. When not to do it.

Some things we must relinquish.

Some things we must resist like hell.

It takes a fair amount of values-based discernment to choose which one we should do at which moment. That's part of where 'acting with reason' comes in. And, there are some specific spiritual practices we can try which help us feel the answer more deeply in our bodies than doing a mere thought experiment.

Here's just one practice with several different ways of doing it (as suggested by the good folks at Soul Matters):

New Years is about resisting old patterns and creating new ones. Many find that picking a "word for the year" helps them stay on track and resist their old patterns more easily. Faith Formation News: January - Rest as Resistance

As we enter the new year, our congregational theme invites us to ponder Resistance. In a society often driven by burnout and the pressures of unfettered capitalism, we are reclaiming a radical truth: Rest is a form of resistance. We have had a beautifully busy church year so far, but to win against the injustices of the world, we must ensure our own cups are not empty. In honor of this need for renewal, you will notice a lighter calendar for January and February. We invite you to look to nature during these colder months—to slow down, breathe, and find the restorative rest your family needs.

Sunday Morning Schedule

Please note the following flow for our children and youth (ages 17 and under) this month so you can plan accordingly:

- January 4th: Intergenerational Service. All children and youth will remain in the sanctuary for the full worship service.
- January 11th: Students will go straight to their Faith Formation classrooms at the start of the hour.
- January 18th & 25th: Students will begin in the sanctuary for the start of worship before heading to their classes.

Program Updates & Adjustments

In our commitment to restorative practices, we have adjusted our program calendar for the month:

- Kids Night In (KNI): There will be no Kids Night In events held during the month of January. We are taking this time to pause and rest.
- Crossing Paths: Our interfaith exploration group will be shortened slightly this month, meeting for three sessions instead of the usual four.
- OWL (Our Whole Lives): We resume our sessions on January 10th. To allow for deeper focus and more space between meetings, we will meet for a "retreat" style session from 10:00 AM to 3:30 PM, rather than our typical weekly two-hour sessions.

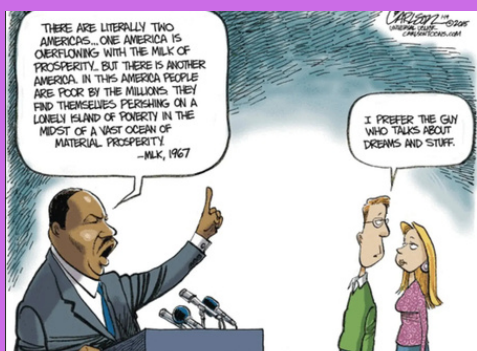
Don't Resist, Relinquish - The Burning Bowl Ritual

As we typically do on the first Sunday of the new calendar year, we will do a burning bowl ritual - ritualistically relinquishing that which no longer serves as we enter a new trip around the sun together. Like the symbolic flash paper which we must quickly throw in the air or risk burning ourselves, we practice letting go when we resist doing so. 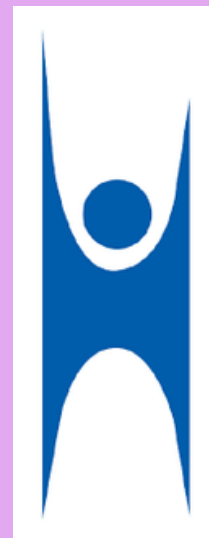
