From your Minister, October 2025

Our new church year has hit the ground running. The 4th year of the jazz season has kicked off with a wonderful concert featuring John Hobbs and Josef Patchen last week. We have started an Our Whole Lives (OWL) sexuality education program for the first time in several years. Justice activities continue to percolate and expand the reach of our Mission and ties to the wider community. We've also seen notable progress on our security enhancements, funded by a grant from FEMA (thanks again to Debby Crane Campanella and Matt Maurer for all their work securing that grant and for Nike and now Brandy for pushing us through the physical changes which will keep us all safer). Our playground is once again completely fenced in. Our front doors have been refurbished, which will allow them to last several more years for us with some new security hardware enhancements like a panic bar. We have a new state-of-the-art security system from ADT always monitoring our building. And, we will soon have security film on nearly all our windows which will help slow down anything which might break the glass. Next up, we expect to replace all but a few of our external doors and add an entirely new exit out toward the labyrinth in the next few months (we're unsure about the exact timing as we await the materials needed for those projects).

All good things!

And there are more big things coming up, too this month. First, and very importantly, the Pastoral Care and Membership Teams and I invite you to a workshop on **October 4th (from 12:45-3 PM, starting with a provided lunch)** to learn about our newly developing UUCA Network of Care. This is such an important project which will help strengthen our community bonds and capacity to care for each other. Mutual care is always important, but especially in precarious and chaotic times like right now.

Please, please, consider coming to learn how to get involved and serve.

This work happens to bridge our theme from September (Building Belonging) with our theme for October – Cultivating Compassion. An important topic, considering our Mission statement and UU Values. Both of which mention the importance of *acting* with compassion to us as Unitarian Universalists here in the CSRA and wherever our journey(s) take(s) us. The work we are planning to do together is indeed a spiritual practice in and of itself because it intentionally connects us to something bigger than ourselves – each other; while simultaneously helping to sustain our within because of the resulting grounding and security we feel. Yet, it's incumbent upon us to also practice compassion in our own more private spiritual practices. Scroll down the newsletter for a couple suggestions to try. And perhaps check in with some of your friends or fellow members of any UUCA caucus group you're a part of about how they're doing with these or any other spiritual practice.

In addition to the October 4th event, we also have our annual service auction coming up – this year with a special twist: we're coupling it with a jazz concert from saxophone player Tim Sanders. Please see more information in some of the following pages about how you can get involved and attend.

Spiritual Practice Suggestions for October

Option 1

Self-compassion is a skill that is not often taught or encouraged in our culture. It is treated as something we will "get around to when there is time." Self-compassion isn't just about us. It's indeed a very important practice which allows us to be as compassionate as possible with others. (Though to believe you *must* be compassionate with yourself or 'love yourself' in order to offer the same for others is a harmful idea to be cautious about promoting. Even worse is the idea that you must love yourself to receive love from others. No matter what, you are worthy of love and compassion just by being alive).

That said, this exercise has you do the opposite of "getting around to it" by inviting you to do it regularly throughout the month. To help you do that, we've created a <u>large list</u> of ways to be compassionate and gentle with yourself. Just print out the list and then, throughout the month, do at least five of the options. - After doing the activities you've chosen from the list, reflect on these questions:
- Was there a common theme to the activities you picked? What might that say about your deeper longings or needs?
- Did you struggle with picking or doing any of the activities you choose? Why was that?
- Were you glad you only had to do five? Or did you wish you had time to do a lot more?
- Did you feel different after doing all the activities you picked? Did the activities lead you to viewing life, others or yourself in a different way?

Option 2

We are mixed and complicated creatures. Our natural instinct and inclination to be compassionate sits right alongside many competing and conflicting instincts and urges. So it's not surprising that research indicates that our desire to be more compassionate needs the support of us pairing it with a commitment to setting intentions.

So for this exercise, you are challenged to engage in some intentional compassion. The instructions are simple, even though the application is not. Basically, you are asked to take a week and begin each day by setting an intention to be compassionate in a particular way.

Here's one way to go about it:

- Set your intention as early in the day as you can.
- Prepare yourself by finding a private space where you can center yourself by bringing awareness to your breath and calming your body.
- Think about the day ahead of you and identify likely situations you will face where greater compassion might be needed.
- Then with that in mind set an intention related to those situations you've identified. Your intention can be as general or specific as feels right to you. Just make sure it is connected to the situation you want to focus on. For instance, a specific one might involve committing to being more compassionate with a particular co-worker or researching a social issue so you can figure out a way to get more involved, not just think about it. Similarly, a more general intention might have to do with a habit you want to cultivate, like being more encouraging with others or being less judgmental toward yourself. - Write down your intention in a few words on a small card or piece of paper that you can carry with you throughout the day.
- Revisit your intention throughout the day.
- At the end of the day, reflect on how your intention impacted your day.
