
CONFIRMATION CLASS



Boyle County Homeless Coalition Presentation

Amy Anness and Colin Ratiere joined us after worship January 18 with details and updates on the efforts of the Boyle County Homeless Coalition. The Coalition is a result of efforts originating with the Boyle County Task Force on Homelessness under Magistrate Steve Sleeper's leadership.

The Coalition's goals are to reduce, assist, and prevent homelessness through community partnerships, advocacy, education, and kindness; with three areas of focus: Basic Needs, Sheltering Options, and Case Management.

In the latest stage ('New Ground') in partnership with Family Services Association land has been donated by Family Services Association (next to their offices on 3rd Street), a zoning change has been approved, and the next step is raising \$15,000 needed to generate a plat for the property which will ultimately be used for tiny homes to individuals and families struggling to afford housing.

In the meantime work is ongoing to meet folks where they are providing food, temporary shelter, and support.

Recently, Brice Gibson, Homeless Coalition Coordinator, relocated to an office at 445 S. 4th St., Suite B, which provides a large enough location to provide services to folks experiencing housing instability. 'The Bridge Recovery Community Center' office will provide a central location for the services offered by the Coalition, basic needs, sheltering options, and case management.

NEWS FROM OUR PARTNER IN MISSION: WITNESSING MINISTRIES OF CHRIST

The youth choir from one of Witnessing Ministries of Christ's schools in India was invited to participate for the first time in a Christmas choir competition in the major regional city of Agra. Coming from rural villages, the Dalit school children felt intimidated because most had never been to a big city before. Out of 20 choirs, they were the only one from a village. But they greatly impressed the judges, placing second in the competition, and were awarded a trophy almost as tall as they are!

The win meant more than a trophy, for it taught the students that they can be successful and achieve recognition above the status as "outcastes" assigned them by their culture. And the award also helped the urban audience to see beyond their stereotypes of rural Christians. The choir's performance indeed proved to be a "big win" in more ways than one.
