I was able to be present from my recliner thanks to Rebecca Face-Timing me in, but I missed hearing you all talk about the individuals and organizations you wanted your share of the surplus to be given to. Thanks for your prayers - I'm fully recovered now, and it looks like 3 days of forced rest has also cleared up my back issue, for which I'm truly grateful!

The total amount of the gifts to the people and organizations you brought to the table came to \$37,200. The Session voted last night to divide up the remaining \$7,800 equally between all the names you brought, which means everyone will receive an additional \$162.50. CONFIRMATION CLASS

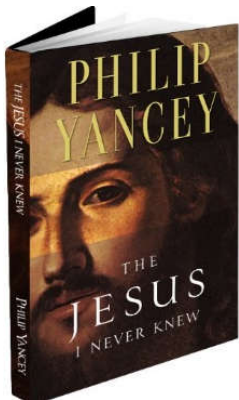
Beginning Sunday, March 1
