As I continue to transition from my role as Director of Christian Formation to Pastor-elect, I am grateful for all our members who continue to ensure we have meaningful and varied opportunities to learn together. Just this past week:

- Centre student Marae Mallard made it possible for us to host Whitney Austin, founder of Whitney/Strong, and learn of her organization's work to pass bi-partisan legislation to reduce gun violence, as well as tangible small actions to the same end.
- Kathy Miles invited Alonda Adewale and Anthony Strong from Recovery Life Centers here in Boyle County, so we can learn from their work of providing housing, programming, and peer support for people beginning their journey into long-term recovery from substance use disorders.
- Scott Johnson and the World Mission committee made it possible for us to hear from Milad Vosgueritchian, Co-Founder and Executive Director of Peace and Justice Education at House of Hope Vision School in the West Bank, and learn about trauma-informed education that helps these young children not respond to the sometimes daily violence they experience with violence themselves.

Each of these organizations are doing important work rooted in God's love and justice, and each ask us the question, "What can we do to partner in this kind of work?"



This evening I'm beginning a short video series featuring John Swinton titled, "Discipleship at the Margins." John is a Scottish theologian, academic and Presbyterian minister who specializes in the area of mental health and nursing. He is the Master of Christ's College at the University of Aberdeen. I hope you'll come for dinner at 5:30, and then stay for the discussion of the first video in this series.


Both these organizations receive some support from your Deacons' Aid Grants.

MENTAL HEALTH MOMENT



Watch for the bright blue boxes starting to show up around town that say "Free Narcan." They are being placed in the community to make saving lives of people who have overdosed on an opioid as easy as possible. Everyone is invited to take Narcan from those boxes, and read the simple instructions available on how to administer it. You never know when you might need it. The widespread availability of Narcan has helped to contribute to our Boyle County overdose deaths decreasing in 2024.

REFUGEE PROJECT




This month's focus is toiletries, diapers and cleaning supplies. Please bring items to the box located in the Fellowship Hall labeled "Refugee Project."
