

### WEEKLY UPDATE November 5, 2025

Friends,

If you weren't able to join us in worship this past Sunday, I hope you'll take time to either watch the second sermon of stewardship season by clicking <a href="here">here</a>, or read it by downloading a PDF <a href="here">here</a>. As we discern as individuals, families and as a congregation what we will pledge to the ongoing mission of God in which we are being invited to participate in 2026, listening to the written and proclaimed Word together will help us with our discernment. This past Sunday we reflected on the faithful stewardship of those who have gone before us, and what their fidelity enables us to do in this generation. And we pondered the question of what we might do to be faithful stewards so that those who come after us will be grateful, just as we are.

But our giving is not limited to our financial resources. It also includes our time and talents, our gifts, and that is what we will focus on during the third worship service of this year's stewardship season. Chances are, you have a gift, or talent that you enjoy expressing but which you have not considered to be something that could serve the church. Often, these are our hobbies - things we enjoy doing. Growing a garden - flowers or vegetables or both. Making music. Knitting or crocheting. Making things with our hands. Playing boardgames. We spend time and money on these things because they bring us - and others - joy. But often, we don't consider them as gifts to offer to the mission of the Church, usually (and sadly) because the Church has not valued those things. But what if the thing that brings you joy is the very thing that God had gifted you with in order to serve God's purposes? For most of us that will require a conversion of the imagination - again! - as well as pondering the question, "How exactly might this thing that I love to do be a gift I can offer to God in the context of the congregation to which I belong?"

You'll be receiving a letter from the stewardship committee in a few days' time, accompanied by the pledge card for 2026. We've added a new line to that card: "Gift/talent." When you receive the card, as well as praying about what financial commitment you will pledge to the mission of God as it's expressed through our congregation next year, please also pray about what gift or talent you can pledge to God's mission among and beyond us in the coming year. We'll collect those cards, and see if there are any gifts or talents that several of us share, and which we might be able to offer together in some new venture. That includes our young disciples, so if you have any living with you, please sit with them and invite them to think about what gift or talent they might have to share.

Don't forget the timeline in the Fellowship Hall - please take a moment to add significant dates for you and your family, as well as any photos that might capture those moments, or others that are special memories. And plan on joining us on Consecration Sunday when we'll gather to worship our generous God, and pledge our time, talent and treasure to God's work in 2026.



Join us Sunday for a presentation by Casey Atwood, representing CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) of the Bluegrass. A CASA volunteer serves as a voice for an abused or neglected child, identified by the state's DCBS/CHFS (Department for Community Based Services/Cabinet for Health and Family Services). CASA volunteers investigate and gather information, advocate in Family Court, develop relationships with children, provide a consistent presence for children, and monitor a child's well being. Your Deacons' Aid Grant helps to train volunteers.


#### **DYC Canned Goods Drive**

The Army operates a Tuesday evening youth program, providing transportation to and from this weekly get together. Young adult volunteers, some from Asbury University, work with Captain and Lieutenant (Judah) Irvin to provide a Christian based program each week. The Deacons' Aid Grant also supports the Army's local summer camp for kids and may send a camper to the regional camp in Burkesville.
