



A Message from Michelle. . .

Finding a Rhythm for Life

Have you ever felt like you're just "off"? Maybe you can't pin-point exactly what's wrong, but you just feel off kilter or out of step? In her book, *The Sacred Pulse*, Rev. April Fiet describes holy rhythms that are built into creation and even built right into each of us. Fiet discusses some of the ways we might fall out of step with these holy rhythms. When we are out of sync with "the sacred pulse," we end up feeling worn out and frustrated. It's like we're swimming against a current.



This September we'll turn to Fiet's book for our worship series to explore ways that we can discover and settle into these holy, life-giving rhythms. We have copies of the book available if you'd like to read it. We'll have a two-part discussion for anyone interested in digging in a little deeper to the book (on Mondays, September 12 & 19, at 5:15pm). And, I'm so excited to tell you that on Sunday, September 25, Rev. Fiet will be our guest preacher in worship, and she'll join us for the Fellowship Coffee after the service to answer your questions about the book.

Dear Friends,

It's another beautiful day here at Highlands! It's beautiful because we are hosting a family reunion of nearly 200 people! They're having a blast!! It's beautiful not because Summer Camp 2022 has just come to an end, but because Summer Camp 2022 was filled with lots and lots of happy campers (approximately 170 participants). Our summer counselors did an amazing job of connecting with the campers and providing camps filled with meaningful experiences. It's beautiful because there are still many more groups coming to camp this summer. Of course, I could mention the other spectacular views from this summer -- Mt. Meeker and bear and moose and wild flowers and deer and elk and ... you get the idea. Mostly, it's beautiful because the long history of Highlands continues -- a history of helping people of all ages experience the presence of God.

You play a significant role in keeping the beauty of Highlands alive. Thank you so much for your gift to Highlands! Your generosity, along with the generosity of others, enables Highlands to address its financial needs. Please know that your generosity helps make possible the ministry of Highlands!

Perhaps you are interested in knowing about some of our current dreams:

- -We are looking to greatly expand our programming so that we are offering programs for churches, community groups, and individuals all year long. The dream of having a year-round, full-time Program Director will greatly enable us to make a difference in the lives of children, teens, adults, and families.
- -We are currently making progress in getting greatly expanded internet capabilities at Highlands. We have already expanded our bandwidth tenfold. More improvements are on the way, which will greatly improve the Highlands experience for both our staff and the majority of our guests. Of course, those who want to "escape the internet" will still be able to do so by not utilizing the password.
- -We are currently studying bids to upgrade our kitchen. As you may be aware, most of the current equipment was installed twenty years ago when the "new" Retreat Center opened. Some of the equipment is actually much older, having served Highlands for many years in the old kitchen. The current equipment has served us well, but has outlived its life expectancy and is temperamental in performance. Our four most recent Food Services Managers all concur that upgrades are needed.
- -I am developing a task team to explore our staff housing needs. We have two modern houses. Much of our other staff housing was on site when Highlands began in 1945. Providing adequate staff housing is obviously one of the essential ingredients to Highlands maintaining a content year-round and summer staff. Many previous employees have identified staff housing as one of the reasons they left Highlands.

Ways to Support Highlands

- Keep the leadership of Highlands in your prayers asking that God will guide the decisions that will take Highlands into a future that is as faithful or even moreso than its past.
- -Volunteer your time for service days helping to prepare or close summer camp for the season.
- -Volunteer as a nurse or front desk greeter or kitchen helper or lifeguard or ... let us know what works for
- -Encourage others and your church to support Highlands with their participation and their financial gifts.

YOUR FINANCIAL SUPPORT IS KEY

Yes, Highlands is a beautiful place. We can be thankful that God has worked through generous donors to pay off the mortgage for the Retreat Center. We now focus our attention on a revised set of needs -expanding our programming, maintaining a now 20 year old Retreat Center and cabins that are much older, ways to improve the Highlands experience for both guests and staff. I pray that God will continue to work through you and other generous supporters to help Highlands flourish into the future.

Once again, I thank you for your generosity. We could not make camp affordable for all campers and address our capital improvement needs without such gifts. Your gifts of today will continue to give well into the future!

Dear Folks:

I am writting to you on behalf of all the men hear that are involved in the gardening. We would like to say Thank You for your help and the kindness that you have shown us.

We just recently recieved the Bird Baths that you droped off this past April. They were held up for some reason. We are not all that sure why, but when we got them I delivered them to their places. One to the Vet's unit, one to the flower garden in the main yard on the East side and one the Honor House Vegie Garden. They were set up right away and of course, the birds took advantage of them as soon as we put water in them. It was truely a happy day. The bird baths were something that we had never seen inside the walls and fences and when combined with the gardens they created beautiful vistas of peace. A place that one could go and sit for a time, free from the chaos that surounds us all.

I go and sit now, early in the morning, just I did before the bird bath was set up in the Vegie garden behind the unit and I watch the birds and the insects and other little critters as they go about their business of the day. The difference now, is that we have a beautifull bird bath for the birds and the bees to gather at & not the old trash can lid that we had been useing. We still have a bowl on the ground for the lizzards and other little critters to drink from and they come often.

These gardens have become places of peace and contentment. Sources of pride and that give some, meaning and purpose where once there was little or none. They are places that give something to look forward to. They have given some a reason to hope again and beleive that there can be a better future for them. To help to restore someones self respect and self worth is an incredible blessing. To mend a broken soul and spirit the way these gardens do for some, Words can not discribe the feeling one gets when you see that transformation. To see a once broken and defeated person, become whole again, even if just for a short time. How do you put that into words!

Our little garden behind the Honor House has so far, produced more than 200 pound of produce that has been donated to the food bank hear in Sterling. The men have been able to eat from their gardens and have shared the bouty with the other men in the program. The other gardens on the east side, now total 7 in all. with an estimated $100 \pm involved$. Our little garden alone has 18 of us involved. There are also flower gardens in front of some of the units and the men who take care of them are truely greatfull for the chance to do so. Weather a flower or squash, the benefit to the spirit and soul are the same.

For all that you have done for us, we want you to know that we are greatfull. That we appreciate your kindness and blessings.



PASTOR'S REPORT


