


If you have a loved one who has died in the last year, please contact the church office by October 31 to have your loved one's name included in the All Saints prayer.



EOG FAQ's

What's an "EOG"?

EOG stands for Estimate of Giving. Some people call this a "pledge." It's your estimate of how much you plan to give to the church in the coming year.

Why should I turn in an EOG?

We hope you'll turn in an EOG for two reasons:

- 1. It really helps the elders plan and make faithful financial plans for the coming year when we have your Estimates of Giving.
- 2. Thinking in advance about how much you feel called to give is a spiritual practice that helps you to grow in faith.

What if something happens and I need to change my EOG mid-year?

It's easy to change your EOG. If you want to change your EOG for any reason at any time, just contact the church office and we adjust your EOG accordingly.

Thank you for your continued annual partnership in **Cooperating Ministry's Christmas Basket Program**. Regardless of how you say it, hunger harms! Your giving is not just about donating; it is about making a difference in "Logan County"! Hunger related issues affect many households within our community. Every can, bag or box of food is a step in filling an essential need for a hungry household. Food does the soul good!

Christmas is around the corner, and the 2022 Christmas Basket Program food items need to be collected and tallied for the basket distribution starting **December 5**th. I write this letter with great faith that your congregation will participate in this effort to help those struggling with food insecurities this Holiday Season. HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE SEPTEMBER SESSION MEETING

The Session of First Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), Sterling, CO, held a regular meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 20, 2022, at 5:15 p.m. in the conference room. Deacon Rep, Tammie Malone, was seated & given voice.

Pastor's Report:

- · A written report was received.
- Wren Olivia Jackson, daughter of Cooper& Callie Jackson, born on Nov. 15, 2021, was baptized during worship on September 18, 2022, by Rev Michelle.
- Faith Council (formerly Ministerial Alliance),
 CCOA (Community Churches Offering Assistance) Update: The individual receiving assistance through the CCOA program is doing well. Faith Council may request additional funding because fewer churches have contributed funds than the Faith Council anticipated.
- A community Thanksgiving Service is tentatively being planned for Sunday, November 20, in the afternoon, at Sterling Middle School.

Miscellany:

• IT WAS VOTED to approve the following time away for Rev. Michelle: Relevance to Resonance project: Oct. 5-7 (Chicago, IL) and Clergy Retreat/. Reading Week: Oct 10-14, 2022 (Salida, CO/Sterling, CO).

Clerk's Report:

- IT WAS VOTED to accept the bid from Ford AV for \$6,398.40 to add the ability to show the video feed on the 2 displays in the sanctuary, and to add an additional camera controller in the balcony.
- IT WAS VOTED to approve a request from a member who has moved out of the area to be removed from membership.
- IT WAS VOTED to receive Gary Slimmer as an active member.
- A written report was received from the Aug 27th Presbytery meeting from Elder Commissioner Tanna Prince.

Property:

- IT WAS VOTED to approve the Church Use Request from Elsie Fetzer for a student recital in the sanctuary, October 2, 2022.
- Request from Pat Borner for a Reviewers Club meeting in the Fellowship Hall, Nov. 3, 2022.

Personnel:

- IT WAS VOTED to return to the practice of paying for services as delivered for relief organists.
- IT WAS VOTED to give a 3% raise for 2023 to all salaried, non-ordained staff.
- IT WAS VOTED to recommend increasing the Deferred Compensation Matching Employer Contributions to Michelle's 403(b) retirement plan by 3% of her current salary (\$2,197/year) in 2023.

Nominating:

• IT WAS VOTED to call a congregational meeting to elect officers on Sun. Oct. 23, during worship service.

Mission:

 IT WAS VOTED to designate the local portion of the Peace & Global Witness Offering to Help for Abused Partners.
