

A Message from Michelle. . .

Hamster Wheel or Ferris Wheel

For the last year and a half, I've been participating in a cohort that's looking at the ways in which modern culture seems to be accelerating. There are many benefits to modern technology and modern life, but as the pace of life keeps accelerating, there are some consequences, too. Everything feels like a competition. Rest feels indulgent and lazy. We always feel behind... we just learned how to use this phone, and



now there's an update? How am I supposed to remember *another* password?! The to-do list is never complete. Or: everyone else is speeding successfully along, but you can't keep up, so it feels like everyone and everything is passing you by. People have used the analogy of the hamster wheel... you just have to keep running fast in order to keep the wheel going. Some of us may feel like we're on the hamster wheel; others may feel like they've been flattened beneath it.

What if instead of the hamster wheel, we took a turn on the Ferris Wheel? It's slower (and up at the top, quieter). When you're on the Ferris Wheel, you're not in control. It gives you a new perspective, a more expansive view. It takes you away from the crowds, but it puts you in close proximity to one or two people. It usually evokes a contented sigh and a smile (unless you're afraid of heights?).

Maybe a literal ride on the Ferris Wheel isn't for you, but just like the hamster wheel is a metaphor for the way we move through life, perhaps the Ferris Wheel can be, too.

As summer begins to wane, may you find a Ferris Wheel kind of pace. May you find the blessing of an expansive perspective. May you experience some slowness, some calm, some quiet... and may you enjoy it and be renewed and refreshed by it.

theatrical productions. Her dedication to the arts and her influence on students and the community are undoubtedly invaluable.




