A Message from Michelle. . .

The Season of Lent

This year for the season of Lent we'll be thinking about the ways that we wander from God and God's ways, and we'll listen for God's call to return.

I'll be connecting the Lectionary scripture readings with phrases from the hymn,

Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing:



Come, thou Fount of every blessing; tune my heart to sing thy grace; streams of mercy, never ceasing, call for songs of loudest praise.

Teach me some melodious sonnet, sung by flaming tongues above; praise the mount! I'm fixed upon it, mount of God's unchanging love!

Here I raise my Ebenezer*; hither by thy help I'm come; and I hope, by thy good pleasure, safely to arrive at home. Jesus sought me when a stranger, wandering from the fold of God; he, to rescue me from danger, interposed his precious blood. O to grace how great a debtor daily I'm constrained to be! Let that grace now, like a fetter, bind my wandering heart to thee. Prone to wander, Lord, I feel it, prone to leave the God I love; here's my heart; O take and seal it; seal it for thy courts above.

Throughout the season of Epiphany, we've been on a journey of discovery. The journey continues in the season of Lent as we wind our way alongside Christ on his journey to the cross. As is often the case in life, our paths are not always straight or simple. The road curves, taking us up to mountain top moments, and down into dark valleys. But, no matter how far we wander, Christ is always with us, and God is always ready to rejoice and welcome us when we return.

Have you wandered? Maybe it's time to return. You can begin with the simplest prayer:

Bind my wandering heart to thee...

This Lent, give your wandering heart to God. They say, "not all who wander are lost," and indeed with God, in the end none shall be lost (Luke 19:10; Isaiah 55:11).

Legend for the Journey through Lent

February 11 - Transfiguration - Praise the Mount

It's not Lent yet, but Transfiguration Sunday will serve as a bridge between our Epiphany season of Discover and the Lenten season. We go up to the mountain top with Jesus. (Mark 9:2-9)



February 14 – Ash Wednesday – *Tune my heart*

The tuning fork icon reminds us to pause to tune our hearts at the start of the season. Joel 1:13 (rend your hearts); Psalm 51:10 (create in my a clean heart); Matt. 6:21 (where your treasure is there your heart will be also)



February 18 – First Sunday in Lent – Prone to wander/Rescue me from danger

The waves on this week's map marker remind us of the covenant that God made with all creation after the flood and the way God refreshes us along our journey when we wander through the wilderness (Genesis 9:8-17; Mark 1:9-15)



February 25 – Second Sunday in Lent – Prone to leave the God I love

The rooster icon reminds us of Peter's denial of Jesus on the night of his arrest. Jesus says: "let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me... those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it," but we are often unwilling to follow Christ in suffering. (Genesis17:1-7, 15-16; Mark 8:31-38)



March 3 - Third Sunday in Lent - Teach me

The tablets on this week's map marker remind us to give our time and attention to God's instruction. (Exodus 20:1-17; John 2:13-22)



March 10 – Fourth Sunday in Lent – Jesus sought me

We need sustenance on the journey. The fish reminds us of God's abundant provision. (Psalm 107: 1-3, 17-22; Ephesians 2:1-10; John 3:14-21)



March 17 – Fifth Sunday in Lent – Here's my heart

On the 5th Sunday we pause to remember than God has written the Law on our hearts. (Jeremiah 31:31-34; Psalm 51:1-12)



March 24 – Palm Sunday – Songs of loudest praise

The map marker for us on Palm Sunday is a music note overlaid with a crescendo symbol, which in music means to get louder gradually, because on Palm Sunday we sing our praise. (Psalm 118: 1-2, 19-29; Mark 11:1-11)



March 28 - Maundy Thursday - I'm fixed upon it

Seder Supper Service (6pm) The icon for Maundy Thursday is a fermata symbol which calls for a pronged note or pause in music. On Maundy Thursday we pause to remember Jesus' last supper, and we fix our eyes with him on the cross. (John 13:34-35)




March 31 – Easter Sunday – *And I hope*

A MOMENT FOR MISSION...



The Church received a letter from Highlands Presbyterian Camp and Retreat Center in early December thanking us for our continued support and outlining both accomplishments and plans for next year.

Staff listed the following as major accomplishments during 2023:

Hosted a summer camp for youth of all ages as well as intergenerational.

Water conservation and environment: Replaced 1,000 feet of leaking pipelines, installed low flow devices in the Retreat Center; removed over 600 gallons of hazardous waste from the property; protected our water rights to Rock Creek water.

Structures and safety: Entirely rebuilt the Retreat Center decks, balconies and bridges; upgraded the walk-in refrigerator and freezer to maintain safe temperatures.

Stabilized the operations at Highlands to reduce the operating deficit so that donations and support can go to programming and capital projects.

There is much yet to do, and, according to the letter, our support will help accomplish this:

Focus on the ministry of Highlands and begin programming to live into the vision for Highlands.

Work on the structures for safety, environment and guest experience. This includes energy efficient heating, weather proofing, new roofs, additional gathering spaces and water treatment plant modernization.

Together with the Boulder Valley and Longmont Conservation Districts, implement a Forest Restoration Plan to return health to our forest and mitigate the danger from wildfire. As part of this the camp will be providing 200 cords of firewood to their neighbors in need.

Mike Doyle stated in the letter: "We are very grateful for the 75-year legacy of Highlands — not just the land and buildings but the impact of volunteers, donors, campers, Retreat Center guests and staff. We want to continue this legacy and can do so with your continued thoughts, prayers, and support."

The Session of First Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), Sterling, Colorado, held a regular meeting on Tuesday, December 5, 2023, at 5:30 p.m. in the conference room.

IT WAS VOTED to seat Deacon Sue Weingardt and give her voice.

Upon recommendation of the Deacons, **IT WAS VOTED** to approve \$5,690.00 from the ELSMT fund for medical expenses for a church member.

PASTOR'S REPORT

A written report was received.

A thank you note was received for our donation to the Yucatan Peninsula Mission (YPM).

CLERK'S REPORT


