The Moscow, Orthodox Patriarchate: There is a saying that "the road to Constantinople passes through Moscow." In other words, if we ever expect to attain any form of unity with the Orthodox, we will have to start with the Russian Orthodox Church since it is the largest and most influential of the Orthodox churches.

Presently the Patriarch, Kirill, is the patriarch of Moscow and All Rus. Noted Catholic author, George Weigel, met him once in Washington, D.C. at a dinner held in his honor and describes him as "sophisticated and clever, linguistically gifted; capable of charm; and a politician down to his chromosomes!" This should not have been surprising. A few months short of his 26th birthday, then-Archimandrite Kirill was posted to the World Council of Churches in Geneva. In 1971, the only way a young Russian cleric would get that plum assignment was if he were on the leash (and perhaps the payroll) of the KGB, the Soviet security service (similar to our FBI)!

Fast forward to today, and, as patriarch, Kirill has aligned himself with another old KGB buddy, Vladimir Putin- mass murderer and child-kidnapper in Russian's war to destroy Ukraine. According to a report by the Free Russian Foundation:

In early March 2022, as Russian troops occupied Bucha and Hostomel, Patriarch Kirill declared during a sermon at the Cathedral of Christ the Savior: "Russia is waging not a physical, but a metaphysical battle against the forces of evil in Ukraine." He framed this war as a struggle against sin, stating that it "has not only political significance" but is directly connected to the salvation of humanity- thus giving it religious and sacred justification.

In other words, it's not a war; it's a crusade! Since then, the Russian Church has been engaged in the war on several fronts: Propaganda and ideological support at hone; direct interaction at the frontlines- "mystical support" involving sacred objects, prayers, and rituals to sanctify the war effort; diplomatic manipulation abroad through international ecumenical organizations and espionage.

The Moscow Patriarchate has its own TV channel, SPAS, which reaches every Russian household free of charge. Kirill decreed on this station that any Russian soldier who died in the war would have all his previous sins automatically washed away- a heresy! Even worse was the SPAS documentary entitled "God at War"- which is blasphemy.

It is difficult to now hold that the way to unity with Constantinople is through Moscow, whose patriarch has now abandoned Christian orthodoxy and committed blasphemy. The Russian Orthodox Church has become little more than an arm of the Russian government.
