### We are an "Easter People!"

Being an "Easter People" means that we emphasize the transformative power of Jesus Christ's resurrection. It means living with hope, joy, and a sense of mission inspired by the resurrection. As St. Augustine famously said, "We are an Easter people, and Alleluia is our song," highlighting the call to live in the light of Christ's victory over death.

To be an "Easter people" is to embody the values of faith, hope, and love in daily life. It means imitating Jesus in actions, thoughts, and words, and embracing the mission to bring healing, justice, and compassion to the world. The resurrection is not just a promise of life after death but a call to live fully and abundantly in communion with God, our neighbors, our enemies, and God's creation here and now.

But what does living as an Easter People mean in our daily lives? The Belhar Confession is a Christian statement of faith that originated in South Africa during the struggle against apartheid. It was adopted by the Dutch Reform Church and served as the religious foundation to resist the perpetrators of oppression and violence. It asserts that we are unified under Christ and "that this unity of the people of God must be manifested and be active in a variety of ways:"

in that we love one another; that we experience, practice and pursue community with one another; that we are obligated to give ourselves willingly and joyfully to be of benefit and blessing to one another; that we share one faith, have one calling, are of one soul and one mind; have one God and Father, are filled with one Spirit, are baptized with one baptism, eat of one bread and drink of one cup, confess one name, are obedient to one Lord, work for one cause, and share one hope; together come to know the height and the breadth and the depth of the love of Christ; together are built up to the stature of Christ, to the new humanity; together know and bear one another's burdens, thereby fulfilling the law of Christ that we need one another and upbuild one another, admonishing and comforting one another; that we suffer with one another for the sake of righteousness; pray together; together serve God in this world; and together fight against all which may threaten or hinder this unity (Phil. 2:1-5; 1 Cor. 12:4-31; John 13:1-17; 1 Cor. 1:10-13; Eph. 4:1-6; Eph. 3:14-20; 1 Cor. 10:16-17; 1 Cor. 11:17-34; Gal. 6:2; 2 Cor. 1:3-4)

As we continue our journey together, may we live as Easter People, united and freed by Christ's resurrection promise. May we find ways to imitate Christ, offering healing, love and compassion to the world and resisting evil in all its manifestations, all for the glory of God.

The mystery surrounding the Church Bell

Several months ago, our church bell became inoperable and needed hands-on intervention. Matt McGee's two sons, John and Thomas, climbed up to the belfry to fix the problem. What they found surprised us as we believed that the bell in the third church had been destroyed by the fire of 1940.

They found a bronze Henry N. Hooper & Co. bell (circa 1833-1868), photos were taken and the mystery deepened. Where did it come from? Did the original bell from the third church get restored?

Were we given a bell from another church or did we purchase a used one?

All kinds of questions but few answers!

What we know so far is that it is clearly marked as a Hooper bell. Henry Hooper had originally been apprenticed to Paul Revere before starting his own business in 1833. We know that \$40.00 was appropriated by the building committee to install a bell in 1941-1942 (wonder what the cost would be today?) There is no mention of buying a bell, only installing it. We know that furnishings such as the pews were gotten from other churches (Salem and Plymouth are two mentioned) We know from a transcript of an interview done in the late 1980s that three local men "hid" the bell from the third church for a year. Did they have it rehabilitated or was it beyond repair? We know that at the 1942 dedication of our existing church there was no bell, yet.

If anyone has any insight into our mystery bell or if family stories of the incident still exist, we ask that you share what you think or know with either Matt or myself.


